

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by Sections 29.174 and 227.02 (1)(e), Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby adopts rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Section WCD 20.06 (1)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.06 (1)(b) Trolling. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture or kill fish or fish for fish of any variety at any time in the inland waters of the state from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion; or by means of shutting or drawing off water for that purpose. The restrictions in this paragraph do not apply to the waters of Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas, Polk, Racine, Rusk and Washburn counties and the following named lakes and rivers including their flowages and sloughs:

SECTION 1. Section WCD 20.06 (1)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.06 (1)(b) Trolling. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture or kill fish or fish for fish of any variety at any time in the inland waters of the state from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion; or by means of shutting or drawing off water for that purpose.
