

ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS
ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by section 101.01 to 101.29 Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section Ind 1.05 (1) (Intro. para.) is amended to read:


Ind 1.05 Walks, runways and platforms. (1) Every walk, runway, platform or other surface on which employes work above or below grade or floor level shall be substantially constructed and so maintained, and so far as the nature of the work will reasonably permit, kept free from obstruction or substances over which or on which persons may stumble, slip or fall.

Section Ind 1.05 (4) (Intro. para.) is amended to read:

(4) Every permanent work surface 24 inches or more above or below grade or floor level shall be provided with one of the following means of access.

The rules and amendments contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code as provided in Section 227 Wis. Stats.
