

ORDER OF

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by section 101.01 to 101.29 Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby amends and adopts Ind 59.20 Drawings, Specifications and Data to read as follows:


Ind 59.20 Drawings, Specifications and Data. (1) Design and Preparation of Drawings. All drawings and data for the installation of heating, ventilating and air conditioning equipment shall be designed and prepared to satisfy the requirements of this code.

(2) All drawings and design data to be submitted for review and approval under the provision of this code for buildings greater than 50,000 cubic feet shall be sealed or stamped by an engineer, architect, or designer registered in accordance with the laws of Wisconsin.

NOTE: Laws regulating the practice of engineering and architecture are found in section 443. Wisconsin Statutes.

The rule will become effective on January 1, 1971.
