ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Natural Resources by section 144.025 (2) (c), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources hereby creates rules as follows:

Chapter NR 100 of the Wisconsin administrative code is created to read:

SECTION 1. Chapter NR 100 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

Chapter NR 100. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION GENERAL ORDERS.

SECTION 2. NR 100.01 of the administrative code is created to read:

100.01 ORGANIC MERCURY COMPOUNDS. The discharge of organic mercury compounds to the waters of the state shall not exceed 0.0005 mg/l of mercury as measured in a 24-hour composite sample.

SECTION 3. NR 100.02 of the administrative code is created to read:

100.02 INORGANIC MERCURY COMPOUNDS AND METAL MERCURY. The discharge of inorganic mercury compounds and metallic mercury to the waters of the state shall not exceed the background level by more than 0.05 pound per 1,000,000 gallons of effluent discharged. The maximum discharge of inorganic mercury compounds and metallic mercury shall be 0.15 pound of mercury per day averaged over a 30-day period; however, in any one day there shall not be a discharge in excess of 0.50 pound.

SECTION 4. These rules shall become effective April 1, 1971.
