

ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

ORDER NO. M-1-71

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Natural Resources by sections 23.09, 23.11, 27.01, 28.02 and 227.021, Wisconsin Statutes, the Department of Natural Resources hereby creates, amends, adopts and repeals rules as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 45.01 (3)(1) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(1) Picnic area--any tract of land developed and maintained for picnicking and containing not less than 5 picnic tables. Included in the definition of picnic area are adjacent playground and play field areas.

SECTION 2. NR 45.01 (3)(m) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(m) Bathing beach--any water area designated as a swim area by standard regulatory markers including those adjacent upland areas designated and maintained as a beach area.

SECTION 3. NR 45.01 (3)(n) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(n) Adult group--a group made up of adult members (18 years of age and older) of an established organization.

SECTION 4. NR 45.05 (1) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to suffer his dog, or cat or other pet to enter any public building or to be upon any bathing beach, or picnic area, ~~designated swimming area in any state park, state forest, fish hatchery, state park recreation area or similar public use area or other lands and property under the management, supervision and control of the department.~~ In those all other state park areas where pets are permitted, and in campgrounds, picnic areas, headquarters areas and ranger stations on ~~state forests or other properties under the management, supervision and control of the department,~~ other lands or property as defined in NR 45.01 (1), dogs shall at all times be kept on a leash not more than 8 feet long. All ~~other~~ cats and other pets shall be effectively, ~~restrained or~~ under the owner's control at all times. No person shall suffer his dog, cat or other pet to ~~deprive or disrupt~~ interfere in any manner with the enjoyment or use of any area by others.

SECTION 5. NR 45.08 (2) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(2) It shall be unlawful to operate or park any motor vehicle as defined in Sec. 340.01 (74), Wisconsin Statutes, which is required to be registered by law, ~~except for motor driven sleds, toboggans, or other snowmobiles upon any bridle path, hiking trail, beach area, playground, picnic area, golf courses (except golf carts on golf courses) or any area other than on lands under the control and management of the department except on established roads highways, parking areas, boat ramps and service areas, or unless specifically authorized to do so by law or administrative rule.~~

SECTION 6. NR 45.08 (4) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(4) It shall be unlawful to land any aircraft on the water or ice in the following state properties: Devil's Lake in Devil's Lake State Park, Sauk County; all waters in Governor Dodge State Park, Iowa County, and Willow River State Park, St. Croix County; Crystal Lake in the Northern Highland State Forest, Vilas County; Lake of the Dalles in Interstate Park, Polk County; Mauthe Lake in the Kettle Moraine State Forest, Fond du Lac County; Lake Seven in the Kettle Moraine State Forest, Sheboygan County; Ottawa Lake in the Kettle Moraine State Forest, Waukesha County; Interfalls Lake in Pattison State Park, Douglas County; Yellowstone Lake in Yellowstone Lake State Park, Lafayette County.

SECTION 7. NR 45.08 (5)(c) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(c) It shall be unlawful to conduct or engage in snowmobile races on all lands under the management, supervision and control of the department.

SECTION 8. NR 45.08 (6) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(6) It is unlawful to operate any motor vehicle, including but not limited to, trail bikes, motorcycles, mini-bikes, and all terrain vehicles on all lands and waters of the state under the management, supervision and control of the department unless specifically authorized by law, or administrative rule. In the Northern Highland State Forest, American Legion State Forest, Flambeau River State Forest, Brule River State Forest and the Black River State Forest areas where such vehicles may be used may be designated by the forest superintendent.

SECTION 9. NR 45.09 (1)(d) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(d) The following waters in the Northern Highland State Forest:

1. Crystal Lake, Sections 27 and 28, T41N, R7E, Towns of Plum Lake and Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
2. Starrett Lake, Sections 13, 14, 23, and 24, T41N, R7E, Town of Plum Lake, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
3. Wildwood Lake, Section 33, T41N, R7E, Town of Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
4. Firefly Lake, Sections 28 and 33, T41N, R7E, Town of Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
5. Emerald Lake, Sections 32 and 33, T41N, R7E, Town of Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
6. Little John, Jr. Lake, Sections 28 and 29, T41N, R7E, Town of Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.
7. Fallison Lake, Section 33, T41N, R7E, Town of Boulder Junction, Vilas County, Wisconsin.

SECTION 10. NR 45.09 (1)(q) of the Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

(q) On the waters of Little Falls Lake in Willow River State Park in Sections 4, 8, and 9, T29N, R19W, Town of St. Joseph, and Sections 8 and 9, T29N, R19W, Town of Hudson, St. Croix County, Wisconsin.

SECTION 11. NR 45.09 (1)(v) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(v) All the waters of Cruzen and Smith Lakes in the Lone Rock Wildlife Area, Richland County.

SECTION 12. NR 45.09 (1)(w) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(w) On all the waters of Jersey Valley Lake, Section 13, T14N, R4W, Town of Christiana, Vernon County, Wisconsin.

SECTION 13. NR 45.09 (1)(x) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

(x) On all the waters of Sidie Hollow Lake, Section 10, T12N, R5W, Town of Franklin, Vernon County, Wisconsin.

SECTION 14. NR 45.09 (3) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(3) On the waters of Yellowstone Lake in Lafayette County, Wisconsin, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motorboat in a careless, negligent or reckless manner so as to endanger the life, property, or person of others, or to operate a motorboat at a speed greater than 5 miles per hour or in excess of steerage or no wake speed when within 200 feet of the shoreline, or to operate any motorboat in any area where notices are posted prohibiting the operation and use of motorboats. On the aforementioned waters, no person shall operate a motorboat towing a person on water skis, aquaplane, or similar device between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and the following 10:00 a.m., or without a competent person in the boat in addition to the operator who shall watch at all times for the safety of any person on water skis, aquaplane, or similar device being towed by said boat. It is unlawful for any person to operate, anchor, moor or beach any houseboat or pontoon boat on the waters of Yellowstone Lake or on the land within the boundaries of the Yellowstone Conservation Area or Yellowstone Lake State Park. It is unlawful for any person to leave any boat unattended whether anchored, moored or beached on the waters of Yellowstone Lake or on the land within the boundaries of the Yellowstone Conservation Area or Yellowstone Lake State Park except within such areas as are designated and posted for such purposes.

SECTION 15. NR 45.09 (5)(c) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(c) No person shall remain overnight in any boat, watercraft or aircraft anchored, moored or docked at any department-controlled dock, wharf, boat landing or marina, or other mooring area except at the marina at High Cliff State Park, at Stockton Island in the Apostle Islands State Forest, at Eagle Island (Horseshoe Island) in the Peninsula State Park, at the campground in Merrick State Park, ~~at the Boaters-Campground in Perrot State Park~~ and at Rock Island State Park. The regular camping fees shall be charged for overnight occupancy of boats, watercraft or aircraft moored at Merrick, ~~Perrot~~, Rock Island and High Cliff State Park.

SECTION 16. NR 45.11 of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any sound truck, loud-speaker, ~~motor, motorboat, motor-vehicle,~~ generator, air-conditioner or other device that produces ~~undue-or-unnecessary~~ excessive or unusual noises without first obtaining a written permit from the ~~department, or its duly-authorized~~ agency.

SECTION 17. NR 45.13 (3)(a) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(a) Payment of camping fees, other than for indoor group camps, is waived between October 31 and the following April 1.

SECTION 18. NR 45.13 (4) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(4) In all state parks, state recreation areas, Kettle Moraine, and Point Beach State Forests and Crystal-Muskie Campground in the Northern Highland State Forest and Yellowstone-Wildlife-Area, a camping permit must be obtained prior to setting up camp during the period between June 15 and Labor Day unless otherwise posted and until December 1 in Meadow Valley Wildlife Area unless otherwise posted.

SECTION 19. NR 45.13 (8) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(8) No person shall camp and no camping unit shall remain for a period greater than 21 days in any 4-week period in the property of registration from June 1 to Labor Day. ~~Thereafter~~ After 21 days the camping unit must be removed from the property for at least 7 days before being eligible to return except in the Northern Highland State Forest, American Legion State Forest, Flambeau River State Forest, Brule River State Forest, Black River State Forest and St. Croix River State Forest when this subsection applies to the campground of registration.

SECTION 20. NR 45.14 (5) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(5) No person shall have in his possession any firearm unless the same is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case while within the exterior boundary of any state-owned lands posted with department signs in Dodge, Fond du Lac, Kenosha, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington and Waukesha Counties or on state forest lands in the Kettle Moraine or Point Beach State Forests except while engaged in hunting or while dog training or at a target range.

SECTION 21. NR 45.16 (1) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to use any facility, land or area for which a fee or charge has been established by the department without payment of such fee or charge as listed in the following schedule:

SECTION 22. NR 45.17 (1) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:

(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any automobile, motor truck, motor delivery wagon, bus, motorcycle or other similar motor vehicle or trailer or semitrailer used in connection therewith in the Point Beach State Forest or in developed recreational areas in other state forests as designated in paragraph (2) or in any state park or roadside park except those designated in paragraph (3) and those specified in S. 27.01 (2r)(b) unless such vehicles has affixed completely thereto by its own adhesive an annual admission sticker or daily admission tag as provided in S. 27.01 (2r)(a) Wis. Stats.

SECTION 23. NR 45.17 (2)(f) 2. and 3. of the Administrative Code are created to read:

2. Firefly Lake Campground
3. Muskellunge Group Campground

SECTION 24. NR 45.17 (3)(m) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

- (m) Rock Island State Park

SECTION 25. NR 45.17 (3)(n) of the Administrative Code is created to read:

- (n) Ahnapee State Trail

SECTION 26. NR 20.07(4)(b) of the Administrative Code is amended to read:


(b) No person shall have in his possession or under his control any gun, bow and arrow, spear or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish on any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters at any time from March 2 to April 20, inclusive, in the Counties of Adams, Brown, Buffalo, Calumet (except during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Chippewa, Clark, Dane, Door, Dunn, Eau Claire, Florence, Fond du Lac (except during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Forest, Jackson, Juneau, Kewaunee, LaCrosse, Langlade, Lincoln, Manitowoc, Marathon (except that spearing is prohibited in the Big Eau Pleine flowage from the dam upstream to Highway 97 from November 1 to April 20), Marinette, Monroe, Oconto in that portion of the county east of Highway 141 only, Outagamie (except during the sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Ozaukee, Pepin, Portage, St. Croix, Sauk, Shawano, Trempealeau, Walworth, Washington, Winnebago (except Waukan Creek and during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water) and Wood. It shall be lawful to take rough fish by means of spear or spear-fishing by the method commonly known as skin diving or bow and arrow from sunrise to sunset in the inland waters of the counties or portions thereof named in this paragraph from April 21 through March 1, both dates inclusive, except in Devil's Lake in Sauk County, and except in Calumet, Fond du Lac and Winnebago Counties during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water. and-as-acted.

The foregoing was approved by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on March 24, 1971.

The amendment herein contained shall take effect on May 1, 1971.
