ORDER OF THE MEDICAL EXAMINING BOARD ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Medical Examining Board by Section 448, Wis. Stats., the board hereby repeals and recreates Chapter Med 1 and Chapter Med 4 attached hereto.

The rules and repeals contained herein shall take effective as provided in Section 227.026 Wis. Stats.

#### Chapter Med 1

# LICENSE BY EXAMINATION TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AND SURGERY; GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Med 1.01 Requirements. All applicants for license to practice medicine and surgery by examination must meet:

(1) Preliminary Requirements. An applicant for license to practice medicine and surgery in this state by examination must present satisfactory evidence of a preliminary education equivalent to graduation from an accredited high school of this state, and of having completed the premedical course of the university of Wisconsin or its equivalent.

(2) Professional Requirements. An applicant for license to practice medicine and surgery in this state by examination must also present a diploma from a reputable professional college approved and recognized by the medical examining board. This board approves and recognizes as reputable professional colleges the medical schools recognized and approved by the council on medical education and hospitals of the American medical association at the time of the graduation of the applicant therefrom.

(3) Licensing Examination. Each applicant for license by examination is required to present to the board with his application for examination, certified photographic copies of:

(a) Diploma representing at least 3 years of pre-medical work, or a certified statement of credits, equivalent to the pre-medical course at the university of Wisconsin.

(b) Diploma from a reputable medical or osteopathic college, having a required course of at least 4 years, or a shorter 3-year course approved by deans of American medical schools.

(c) A certificate showing completion of a 12 months internship in a reputable hospital or approved residency.

(d) A certificate of registration in the basic sciences.

(e) An unmounted, recent photograph of the applicant taken not more than 60 days prior to date of application to be approximately 3 1/2"x 5", and signed by the applicant. A statement by a notary public should be made on the reverse side that it is a true photograph of the applicant.

Med 1.02 Character references. In addition to the requirements of section Med 1.01, each applicant must present character recommendations by two reputable physicians, whose full names and addresses must be given.

## Chapter Med 1 - Continued

Med 1.03 Language of examinations. Examinations are conducted only in the English language.

Med 1.04 Regular examinations. Regular examinations are held in June and December in Madison.

Med 1.05 Passing grade. A FLEX weighted average of 75% is required to pass the examination.

Med 1.06 Regulations during conduct of examination. Applicants shall not be permitted to bring books, compends, notes or other similar helps into the examination room or to communicate by word or sign with other examinees while an examination is in progress, nor shall any applicant leave the examination room during such time or otherwise withdraw from the sight of the examiner or proctor without permission. Social engagements between the examinees and any member of the board, or a proctor, or other person assisting in the examination prior to the completion thereof, are prohibited.

Med 1.07 Numbering of applicants. An examination number will be assigned to applicants who have been accepted as candidates for the examination and will be used as their admission card to the examination. The number issued to the applicant shall be used by him on all examination papers and neither the name of the applicant nor any other mark identifying him shall appear on any such paper.

Med 1.08 Application deadline. Applications must be fully completed and the required fee of \$100 must be mailed to the secretary of the Board at least six weeks before the date of the examination. All remittances must be made by certified check, post-office or express money order or bank draft and made payable to the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board. Fees or any portion thereof are not refundable after the applicant has appeared for the examination.

Med 1.09 Re-examinations. Candidates failing to pass their first examination shall be required to submit another fee of \$100 for each re-examination. Re-examinations shall be given only at the regular scheduled dates in June and December.

Med 1.10 Foreign applicants. An immigrant applicant shall present satisfactory evidence of an immigration visa and satisfy the educational and professional qualifications required by resident applicants. His application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$100.

Med 4.01 Application deadline. Applications and credentials must be completed and on file in our office six weeks prior to the examination.

Med 4.02 Pencil required for examinations. Examinations must be written in pencil and applicants are advised to bring Number two lead pencils for their own convenience.

Med 4.03 Language of examinations. Examinations are conducted only in the English language.

Med 4.04 Type of examination. The examination given by the Wisconsin medical examining board is known as the Federation Licensing Examination (FLEX).

Med 4.05 Examination subjects. Subjects of the FLEX written examination are as follows: Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics/Gynecology, Preventive Medicine, Pediatrics, Psychiatry and Clinical Competence. An oral interview is also required by the Board.

Med 4.06 Passing grade in examination. A FLEX weighted average of 75% is required to pass the examination.

Med 4.07 Regular examinations. Written FLEX examinations are regularly given in June and December in Madison.

Med 4.08 Approved schools of medicine and osteopathy. The board approves and recognizes as professional colleges only medical schools recognized and approved by the council on medical education and hospitals of the American medical association or the American osteopathic association.

Med 4.09 Internship required. The board approves and recognizes a 12-month internship or residency served in a hospital approved at time of service by the council on medical education and hospitals of the American medical association or the American osteopathic association. Proof of service in the armed forces or of a residency will serve in lieu of the final 3 months of an accelerated internship at times of national emergency.

Med 4.10 Preliminary educational requirements. Applicants must present satisfactory evidence of having completed a preliminary educational equivalent to graduation from an accredited high school of this state; and of having completed a college course in physics, chemistry and biology, substantially equivalent to the pre-medical course required by the university of Wisconsin at the time of the applicant's entrance into medical school.

# Chapter Med 4 - Continued

Med 4.11 Basic science certificate required. A Wisconsin basic science certificate issued by the Wisconsin basic science examining board is a pre-requisite to examination. For application blanks and further information concerning the basic science examination, write directly to the secretary of that board.

Med 4.12 Immigration visa required. Applicants who are not native born must present original of either naturalization papers or immigration visa at the meeting at which they appear. These papers will be examined and returned to them at that time.

Med 4.13 Information on locations for practice. The State Medical Society, 330 E. Lakeside Street, Box 1109, Madison, Wisconsin 53701 (mailing address) will submit current list ings of available locations for practice upon request.

Med 4.14 Duplicate and replacement licenses issued. A duplicate license is not issued in the original form, but as a small replica of the original. The fee for this small replica is \$1. A replacement license similar to the original form is issued upon request for change of name by marriage or court order and the payment of \$5.
