

ORDER OF

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by sections 101.01 to 101.25, Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby repeals, recreates and adopts rules of Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter Ind 22, Sanitation.


The rules attached hereto shall become effective on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code as provided in section 227, Wis. Stats.

Ind 22.15 Towels. (1) Where washing facilities are required, the following conditions shall be satisfied:

- (a) The use of towels in common is prohibited.
- (b) The employer shall furnish at least one of the following:
 1. Individual cloth towels.
 2. Magazine type roll cloth towels.
 3. Paper towels.
 4. Approved electric hand dryers with a swivel nozzle provided at the ratio of at least one dryer for every 3 lavatories.

Note: The department will accept the qualified dryers listed by Underwriters' Laboratories.
