PROPOSED

ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY ENERGY ASSISTANCE ADOPTING REVISED RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of Emergency Energy Assistance by Chapter 157 of the Laws of 1973, the Office of Emergency Energy Assistance hereby adopts rules as follows:

OEEA 1.01 Definitions

- (1) "Petroleum fuel" means any petroleum derivative (except natural gas) useable as a fuel and includes fuels classifiable as middle distillate fuels, such as kerosene, jet fuel, home heating oil, range and stove oil, diesel fuel and gas oil, and such other fuels as motor or aviation gasoline or aviation turbine fuel, liquid petroleum gas, propane, butane, or propane-butane mixes, residual fuel oils, and all other refined petroleum products.
- (2) "Wholesale customer or purchaser" means any person, partnership, corporation, cooperative, business, common-law trust, unincorporated association, joint adventurers, or governmental unit or agency purchasing petroleum fuels in lots of 5,000 gallons or more or purchasing coal in lots of 2 tons or more for such wholesale customer or purchaser's own use or in any amount for resale. A wholesale purchaser may also be a supplier.

- (3) "Supplier" means any refiner, importer, jobber, distributor, terminal operator, marketer, or any other person, partnership, corporation, cooperative, business, common-law trust, unincorporated association, joint adventurers or governmental unit or agency supplying petroleum fuels or coal to wholesale customers or purchasers. A supplier may also be a wholesale purchaser.
- (4) "Office" means the Wisconsin Office of Emergency Energy Assistance created by Executive Order No. 64, November 2, 1973, and designated by the Governor under Executive Order No. 72 on December 31, 1973 as his designee for the purpose of carrying out any and all responsibilities contained in Chapter 157 of the Laws of 1973, and its successor.

OEEA 1.02 Reports Required

The following reports shall be submitted to the Office within the times specified:

(1) Suppliers shall submit to the Office on or before August 15, 1974 a one-time report setting forth all sales for consumption in Wisconsin of each type of petroleum fuel or coal for the period January 1, 1970 through December 31, 1973. The report shall specify the quantity of each type of fuel sold in each month of such period. The report shall also specify the storage capacity at each location by product at the time the report is submitted. - (2) Suppliers shall submit to the Office, on forms provided by or approved by the Office, a monthly report setting forth the quantity of each type of petroleum fuel and each type of coal designated on the form which the supplier has had in inventory at the beginning and end of the month and has received and sold during the month for resale or consumption in Wisconsin for the calendar month covered by the report, as well as the supply anticipated for the following month. Suppliers shall, when requested by the Office, furnish with such monthly report a list of wholesale customers and purchasers and the quantities sold to them in the month covered by the report including allocation fractions applied for each class of customers under applicable federal fuel allocation laws and regulations. The reports shall be filed in the Office on or before the seventh day of the month for which the supplier is required herein to furnish information or at such other date as may be specified by the Office.
- (3) Wholesale customers or purchasers shall, when requested by this Office, submit to the Office on forms provided or approved by the Office by the date specified in the request, a report of the quantity of each type of petroleum fuel or type of coal designated on the form which such wholesale customer or purchaser has within the State on the date specified on the request.

FORM FEO 1000

Who Must File a Form FEO 1000? (Prime Suppliers)

- a. Suppliers who own product outside the state and bring it into the state for resale or use in the state, or
- b. Suppliers who buy product outside the state and bring it into the state for resale or use in the state, except when the product has already been reported to Wisconsin on an FEO 1000 as certified by the supplier filing the 1000, or
- c. Refiners within the state who have product for sale within the state.

Gallons must be reported only once on a form FEO 1000.

Who Must File an OEEA Form 10?

- a. All resellers of residual oils, liquid petroleum gas, distillates, gasoline and aviation fuels who buy product in this state from prime suppliers (i.e. those who must file a Form 1000) for resale in Wisconsin, except retail gasoline outlets, and
- b. All prime suppliers who market directly to end users or to retail gasoline outlets (reporting only those gallons so marketed).

How Many Filings Must be Made?

- a. One filing must be made for each bulk storage location whether a terminal (reporting direct end user and retail gasoline outlet sales only), a circuit point or a bulk plant, whether in the state or outside the state but dealing only with product for sale in the state.
- b. Filings are due in the Madison Office of OEEA on the seventh day of each month.

Some gallons will be reported on lOs more than once:

If a reseller sells product to another reseller (other than a retail gasoline outlet), both resellers must report on the form 10. The second reseller shows the gallons under "supplying company" as though the purchase had been made from a prime supplier, identifying the supplying reseller, not the ultimate prime supplier, as the supplying company. CLASSIFICATION OF COALS BY RANK^a

^aThis classification does not include a few coal, principally nonbanded varieties, which have unusual physical and chemical properties and which come within the limits of fixed carbon or calorific value of the high-volatile bituminous and subbituminous ranks. All of these coals either contain less than 48% dry, mineral-matter-free fixed carbon or have more than 15,500 moist, mineral-matter-free British thermal units per pound.
^bMoist refers to coal containing its natural inherent moisture, but not including visible water on the surface of the coal.
^cIf agglomerating, classify in low-volatile group of the bituminous class.

^dCoals having 69% or more fixed carbon on the dry, mineral-matter-free basis shall be classified according to fixed carbon, regardless of calorific value. ^eIt is recognized that there may be nonagglomerating varieties in these groups of the bituminous class and there are notable exceptions in high volatile C bituminous group.
