SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN pursuant to 227.018 (2), Wis. Stats., of a proposed change to Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter MVD 21, Uniform Traffic Citation and Complaint Form.

Chapter 218, Laws of 1973, has resulted in changes to the stipulation and deposit requirements for motorists who are issued traffic citations. This necessitates correcting the instructions on the violator's copy of the Uniform Traffic Citation and Complaint.

Those changes which affect the citation are as follows:

All stipulations of no contest must be processed by the Courts (previously handled by police departments)

Court costs must be remitted in all cases. Stipulation of no contest will no longer save the violator court costs.

The violator will now have ten days in which to stipulate, instead of five days, if he chooses to stipulate.

Under Sec. 345.11, Wis. Stats., a committee prescribes the form of the citation and complaint. Approval for the change has been received from the statutory committee.
