INSTRUCTIONS—READ CAREFULLY

For any charge:

Failure to appear in court as directed or to post a cash deposit will result in issuance of a warrant for your arrest.

The court may refuse to forfeit a cash deposit and order you to appear in court.

FOR VIOLATION OF TRAFFIC CRIMES: Appearance in court is required for charges under certain statutes. 1. The arresting officer has informed you if this citation charges you with a traffic crime.

FOR VIOLATION OF TRAFFIC REGULATIONS: If you do not wish to appear in court to answer this citation, you may satisfy this matter without appearing in court by following one of the two following procedures:

A. Make a STIPULATION AND A DEPOSIT. To do this you must, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE VIOLATION, do the following: 1. Sign the "Statement of Notice" on the back of your citation. 2. Sign the "Statement of Stipulation" on the back of your citation. 3. Mail or deliver your copy of this citation, together with the required amount of deposit, to the police agency that issued this citation (or to the appropriate Clerk of Court if directed to do so by the issuing officer). Remittance should be made payable to the Police Agency (or to the appropriate Clerk of Court if directed to do so by the issuing officer).

B. Make a DEPOSIT ONLY. (No "Stipulation of No Contest" required.) To do this you must, prior to the court date shown on the reverse side, mail the required amount of deposit (plus court costs) to the Clerk of Court at the Clerk's address. Be advised that if you fail to appear in court at the time fixed on the citation, you will be deemed to have tendered a plea of no contest and submitted to forfeiture plus cost not to exceed the amount of the deposit which the court may accept as provided in s. 345.37, or if you fail to appear in court at the time fixed on the citation and if the court does not accept the deposit as a forfeiture for the violation, you will be summoned into court to answer the complaint.

If you have deposited your valid Wisconsin operator's license and you fail to either make a stipulation and deposit, or to make a deposit without stipulation, and you do not appear in court on your court date, the court shall order your license suspended for a period of 30 days or until the case is disposed of, whichever is longer.

STATEMENT OF NOTICE

- Conviction, forfeiture, or stipulation of no contest to the charge described on the reverse side will result in the assessment of demerit points against the driver named on the reverse side. Accumulation of 12, 18, or 24 points in 1, 2, or 3 years respectively will be cause for revocation of driving privileges.
- Conviction, forfeiture, or stipulation of no contest to the charge described on the reverse side will result in revocation or suspension of driving privileges.
