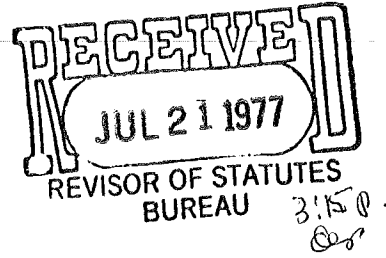

ORDER OF THE VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Veterinary Examining Board by Sections 15.08(5) and 453.06, Wis. Stats., the Veterinary Examining Board repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section VE 1.03 Definitions (5) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is created to read:

(5) "Investigative Services Unit" is the unit within the Department of Regulation and Licensing established to perform investigative and prosecutorial functions at the direction of the board.

VE 1.04 Institution of proceedings of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read:

Proceedings to revoke or to suspend a license or to reprimand a licensee may be commenced by:

(1) Complaint of the Board on its own motion.

(2) Complaint of the Board based upon a written verified statement of facts by an individual.

(3) Complaint of the Investigative Services Unit based on its own investigation.

(4) Complaint of the Investigative Services Unit based upon a written and verified statement of facts by an individual.

VE 1.05 Complaint - Introductory paragraph and (3) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE are amended to read: The complaint shall contain:

(3) A demand in essentially the following form: "Wherefore, the Veterinary Examining Board demands that within twenty days of the service of the complaint the respondent shall file an answer to the charges alleged herein in respect to whether the license of the respondent should be revoked or suspended, or whether respondent should be reprimanded."

VE 2.08 Temporary Permit (1) and (2) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE amended to read:

A graduate of a veterinary college approved by the Board who meets all requirements for examination may be granted a temporary permit to practice veterinary medicine until the results of the next examination are known provided the applicant is employed and supervised by a licensed veterinarian. Applicants for such temporary permit must provide prior to appearance before the board:

(a) Proof of graduation.

2. (b) Permit fee of \$10.00.

(c) Three letters of recommendation to be mailed directly by the writer to the administrative secretary at the board's office.

(2) The applicant must personally appear before the board and satisfactorily answer an oral examination by three of four examining board members in order to obtain a temporary permit. If the applicant does not answer three or more examinations satisfactorily, the applicant may be re-examined at the next regularly-scheduled board meeting without paying an additional fee.
