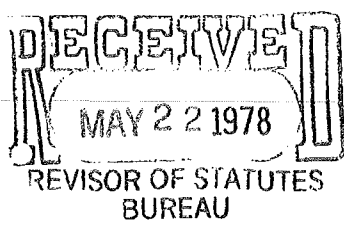

ORDER OF THE WATCHMAKING EXAMINING BOARD AMENDING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Watchmaking Examining Board by section 15.08(5), Wis. Stats., the secretary hereby amends rules as follows:

Sections 1.09 Examination Time and Watch 1.10 Examination of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:


Watch 1.09 Examination Time. A limit of 8 hours shall be given to applicants to complete the practical and written examination.

Watch 1.10 Examination. Each examinee will be furnished a pocket watch with the hair spring distorted and escapement out of adjustment. Each examinee shall fit a balance staff, to be furnished by the Board, true a hair spring, adjust the escapement and make all necessary repairs and adjustments as the Board shall determine. Each examinee will be required to turn a portion of a balance staff to required dimensions. Each examinee shall complete a written examination pertaining to the theory of construction and repair of various types of portable time pieces.

The amendments contained herein shall take affect on July 1, 1978.
