

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

AMENDING, AND REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 23.11, 29.085, 29.107, 29.174 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the Natural Resources Board hereby amends, and repeals and recreates rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 9. is repealed and recreated to read:

9. Deer quotas. a. The department will issue party permits in sufficient numbers to assure the harvest of the number of deer for each quota area indicated in sub. e.

b. Quota areas are composed of single management units or parts of units, the boundaries of which are established in section NR 10.24, Wis. Adm. Code.

c. In each quota area, the number of party permits to be issued to harvest the indicated number of deer is determined by an average of the hunter success rates from the most recent 3 previous seasons or by an average of fewer seasons where a 3-year average is not available. In establishing a quota for an area without an adequate history of party permits, the average success rates of similar quota areas are applied.

d. Party permit success rates used to compute the number of permits to be issued for each management unit are those published by the department in annual deer season reports.

e. Deer management units and 1978 deer quotas.

SECTION 2 - Section NR 10.01 (4) (c) is repealed and recreated to read:

(c) Beaver. 1. Restrictions. It is unlawful for any person to take:

a. In any zone more than the season bag limit established for such zone.

b. More than a total combined season bag limit of 50 beaver in all the open season zones in the state.
