NOV 16 1978

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by Section 115.28(7), Wisconsin Statutes, the state of Wisconsin, Department of Public Instruction, hereby adopts rules as follows:

That PI 3.03(6)(d) is repealed.

That PI 3.04(3)(d) is repealed.

That PI 3.03(7) is repealed and recreated to read:

PI 3.03(7) Special Subject Fields. (a) For the 3-year license in agriculture (200), home economics (210), industrial arts (220), business education (250), instrumental music (505), choral music (511), general music (515), physical education (530), and art (550), the applicant must have completed:

- A professional education sequence of 18 semester credits which includes course work in psychology of learning, child growth and development, curriculum, methods, teaching of reading, and student teaching.
 Preparation for certification to teach in the special fields in grades K-12 must include student teaching at both the elementary and secondary levels.
- 2. A 34 semester credit Approved Program major, except that all majors in music shall complete a 46 semester credit major,

or,

a 22 semester credit Approved Program minor. A license issued on the basis of a minor is valid only during the first 3 years following graduation. Additional certification requires the completion of an

Approved Program major or Approved Program master's degree in the subject.

- (b) Life license may be granted to applicants who have successfully taught the subject in Wisconsin schools for 3 years while holding certification based on an Approved Program major or Approved Program master's degree in the subject.
- (c) The music requirements are effective July 1, 1982. Until July 1, 1982, the 34 semester credit major applies for instrumental music (505) and vocal music (510).
