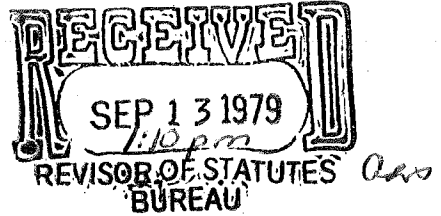




TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

ORDER OF
DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by sections 101.63 and 101.73, Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby creates and adopts rules of Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter Ind 69, Fee Schedule.

The rules attached hereto shall become effective on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in section 227.026, Wis. Stats.

Section Ind 69.21 is created to read:

Ind 69.21 ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS AND MANUFACTURED DWELLINGS.

- (1) Uniform building permit. A fee of \$5.00 shall be remitted to the issuing authority at the time of application for a Wisconsin uniform building permit.
A fee of \$2.00 shall be assessed at the time of application for any permits issued separately from the initial permit. Municipalities administering the Uniform Dwelling Code shall submit these fees to the department on a monthly basis.

Note #1: Permits may be obtained individually or on one form in the categories of construction; heating, ventilating and air conditioning; electrical; and plumbing.

Note #2: An additional fee for plan review may be assessed at the time of application for renewal of the permit.

- (2) Permit to start construction. Where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code, a fee of \$25.00 shall be remitted at the time of application for a permit to start construction of footings and foundation.
- (3) Departmental plan review. The following fees for plan review shall apply where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code:
 - (a) Where employees of the department review plans for dwellings, the fees shall be assessed as follows:
 - 1. New dwellings \$35.00
 - 2. Alterations and additions \$20.00
 - (b) Where an independent inspection agency under contract to the department reviews plans, the fees shall defray the actual cost of the service.
- (4) Departmental inspections. The following fees for on-site inspections shall apply where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code:
 - (a) Where employees of the department perform on-site inspections, the fees shall be assessed at \$35.00 for each required or requested inspection.
 - (b) Where an independent inspection agency under contract to the department performs inspections, the fees shall defray the actual cost of the service.
- (5) Wisconsin insignia. Fees for Wisconsin insignias for manufactured dwellings shall be assessed as follows:
 - (a) Single-unit dwelling \$10.00 per unit
 - (b) Multi-unit dwelling 5.00 per unit

Note: Fees for the Wisconsin insignia include departmental plan review of manufactured dwellings and monitoring of third party inspections.

- (6) Approval numbers. A fee of \$200.00 per number shall be assessed where approval numbers are issued by the department for the approval of materials, equipment and devices.
- (7) Application for variance. The department may grant individual variance to a specific rule upon receipt of a fee of \$25.00 and a completed application for variance form.
