

AMENDING RULES

IN THE MATTER of amending section .  
 NR 10.01(3)(e)1.a. of the Wisconsin .  
 Administrative Code pertaining to . G-46-78  
 deer hunting in Door County .  
 .....

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The rule established a "shotgun only" deer-gun season in Door County. The Joint Committee for Review of Administrative Rules suspended this rule on October 14, 1977 for the 1977 and 1978 hunting seasons. An influencing factor leading to this decision includes the blocking of adjoining counties having the same rules. In addition, a public referendum was held in Door County in November, 1978 in which the "shotgun only" proposal was supported by a vote of 5,214 to 3,404.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 29.174 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 1. a. is amended to read:

Kind of animal and locality	Open season (both dates inclusive)	Limits
a. In the counties or parts of counties of Brown, Buffalo (north of U.S. highway 10), Calumet, Chippewa (south of state highway 64 and west of U.S. highway 53), Dane (west of state highway 78 and north of U.S. highway 18), Dodge, Door, Dunn (south of state highway 64), Fond du Lac, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Outagamie, Pepin (north of U.S. highway 10), Pierce (north of U.S. highway 10), St. Croix (south of state highway 64), Sheboygan, Shawano (south of state highway 29), Waupaca and Winnebago.	Beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 9 consecutive days.	One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length.

The foregoing rule was approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on March 29, 1979.

The rule contained herein shall take effect upon publication.


