

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Transportation by ss. 110.06, 227.014, and 343.51, <u>Stats.</u>, the Department of Transportation hereby proposes to adopt rules (Chapter TRANS 130) interpreting s. 343.51, Stats., as follows:

CHAPTER TRANS 130

SPECIAL IDENTIFICATION CARDS

FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED

TRANS 130.01 <u>Purpose and scope</u>. (1) The purpose of this chapter is to establish the Department of Transportation's administrative interpretation of s. 343.51, Stats., relating to the issuance and use of special identification cards for physically disabled persons.

(2) This chapter applies to any person wishing to obtain an identification card for special parking privileges under s. 346.50(2a) and
(3), Stats.

TRANS 130.02 <u>Application form</u>. Each application for an identification card will contain the following information:

(1) The name and address of the applicant.

(2) The signature of the applicant, parent, foster parent or guardian.

(9) Any other information necessary to assist the applicant and physician to understand the requirements and privileges of s. 343.51, Stats. and this Chapter.

TRANS 130.03 <u>Fee</u>. A fee of \$3.00 will be charged for issuance of an identification card. This fee will apply whether the issuance is for an original permanent or temporary, a replacement, or issuance of another temporary identification card to extend the expiration date.

TRANS 130.04 <u>Identification card</u>. (1) <u>Size and content</u>. The identification card will be 8" x $5\frac{1}{2}$ ". When folded for display, it will be 8" x 2 3/4" and will contain:

- (a) Name and address of the person to whom issued.
- (b) Card number.
- (c) Date of issue.
- (d) Expiration date, if temporary, or the word "permanent".
- (e) "Disabled person" symbol.
- (f) The legend "Physically Disabled Parking Privileges".
- (g) The features described in subparagraphs (e) and (f) will be highlighted in a blue color.

- (4) <u>Restrictions and limitations</u>. (a) In addition to those actions specified as improper use of identification cards in s. 343.52 Stats., no person shall duplicate, reproduce, or copy any identification card.
 - (b) No person under one year of age shall be eligible to be issued an identification card.
 - (c) When a person to whom a permanent identification card has been issued can no longer make proper use of the card, the card shall be returned to the department for cancellation.

TRANS 130.05 <u>Special provisions</u>. The physician's statement shall be in the form and manner prescribed in TRANS 130.02 except:

- (1) A statement already on file with the Department of Transportation relating to some other motor vehicle or operator's licensing action may be used to establish eligibility for issuance of an identification card.
- (2) A letter from a physician containing all the information required in TRANS 130.02 may be accepted as a substitute for the application form.
