PROPOSED ORDER OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

ADOPTING RULES

Analysis Prepared By The Department Of Transportation

This proposal renumbers Chapter MVD 7 as chapter TRANS 126 of the Wis. Adm. Code. This action is being taken as part of a general restructuring and revision of all departmental rules in accordance with s. 227.024 (1) (e), Stats. the rule establishes uniform specifications for all receipts and payment stamps used by municipalities and counties under s. 341.35, Stats., which authorizes local governments to impose a registration fee, also known as a "wheel tax," on automobiles and station wagons registered by residents of their respective jurisdictions. Under the law, the Department may not register a vehicle unless the local "wheel tax" has first been certified as paid in full. No substantive changes are proposed. However, the proposal reflects the amendment of s. 341.35, Stats., by Chapter 221, Laws of 1979 (Budget Review Bill), which permits counties to impose the "wheel tax" on automobiles and station wagons registered by residents of their respective counties. Under prior law, only cities, towns or villages could impose a "wheel tax."

This proposed rule is being adopted without public hearing in accordance with s. 227.02(1) (b), Stats.

Estimate of Fiscal Effect

The changes proposed in this rule will have no fiscal effect on state or local units of government.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation by ss. 110.06(1), 227.014 and 341.35(5) (d), Stats., the Department of Transportation, proceeding without public hearing under s. 227.02(1) (b), Stats., hereby proposes to amend and adopt rules interpreting s. 341.35, Stats., as follows:

Where When stamped or affixed on other documents, it shall also avoid be used in a manner that avoids obliterating of writing or printing.
- (3) All treasurers shall incorporate in any written receipt forms issued the following: "This receipt is not acceptable for state motor vehicle licensing purposes. Do not send this receipt with your application for registration."
