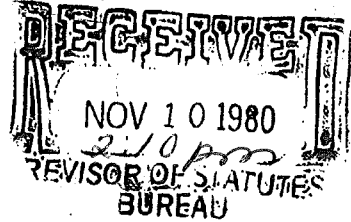

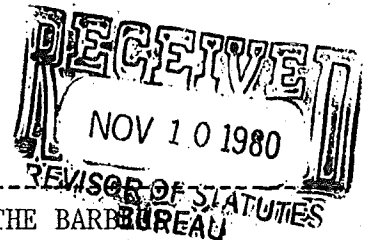

IN THE MATTER OF THE RULEMAKING : ORDER OF THE BARBERS EXAMINING BOARD
PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE : EXAMINING BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING
BARBERS EXAMINING BOARD : OR ADOPTING RULES

Relating to rules concerning storage of paper products, soiled linen and flammable bulk liquid.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

An investigation of a serious fire in Racine in June 1979 determined that the fire was caused by spontaneous combustion of chemicals on soiled towels stored in plastic containers in a beauty salon. The Racine Fire Department requested that the Barbers Examining Board require that paper products or towels and linens soiled by use of chemicals in barber shops be stored in covered metal containers to prevent spread of fire if spontaneous combustion occurs.

The Racine Fire Department also requested the Barbers Examining Board to require that flammable bulk liquids used in barber shops be stored in metal cabinets or containers as a similar safety precaution.

The following rules are being adopted by the Barbers Examining Board as prevention against fires that may be caused by storage of chemicals and materials soiled by chemicals in barbers shops.

ORDER

Now therefore it is ordered that pursuant to authority vested in the Barbers Examining Board in ss. 15.08(5), 158.02(1) and 227.014, Stats., the Barbers Examining Board hereby amends and adopts rules interpreting s. 457.02(1), Stats., as follows:

1. Section B 3.02(1) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

(1) All combs, lifts, brushes, vacuum nozzles, rollers and any other contact equipment shall be washed in hot water with soap or detergent, immersed in a board-approved disinfectant and stored in a disinfected or sanitary storage area after each use. Used combs, lifts, brushes, vacuum nozzles, rollers and any other contact equipment shall be placed in a container, which is marked to indicate they are soiled, until they are washed and disinfected. All laundered linen and paper towels must be stored in a sanitary closed container at all times until ready for use on patrons. Used paper products and linen shall be placed in a closed container after use, except that used paper products and linen soiled by chemical solutions shall be placed in self-enclosing containers constructed of at least 18-gauge metal for overnight storage.


2. Section B 3.02(9) of the Wisconsin administrative code is created to read:

(9) Flammable liquids in a container of one gallon or more must be stored in a covered metal container or in a closed metal cabinet.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026, Stats.
