

## ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES AMENDING RULES

Relating to the use of preventive agents for gonococcal ophthalmiain newborns.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services:

In January, 1981, the National Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, Georgia, revised its recommendation for the use of erythromycin in the prevention of gonococcal ophthalmia in a newborn child. Accordingly, this amendment to H 45.25(4) updates the treatment regimen for prophylaxis of neonatal gonococcal ophthalmia in Wisconsin.

The one comment of the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse was accepted.

A 30-day notice that the agency would amend its rule without a public hearing unless petitioned for a hearing was published in the Wisconsin Administrative Register. No petition was received.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Health and Social Services by s. 143.02(4), Wis. Stats., the Department of Health and Social Services hereby amends a rule interpreting, s. 146.01, Wis. Stats., as follows:

SECTION 45.25(4) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

H 45.25(4) Prevention. The attending physician or midwife is required to place 2 drops of a one percent solution of silver nitrate, or 2 drops of a one percent an ophthalmic solution containing one percent of tetracycline or 0.5 percent erythromycin, or a one centimeter strip of a one percent an ophthalmic ointment containing one percent of tetracyline or 0.5 percent erythromycin, in each eye of a newborn child as soon as possible, but not later than one hour after delivery. No more than one newborn child shall be treated from an individual container. Failure to observe this requirement is punishable by a fine of not more than \$100. (5:-146.02; -State:)

The amendment contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.026(1), Wis. Stats.
