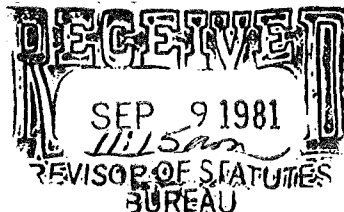




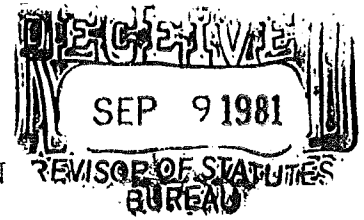
TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, TRADE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

Adopting, Amending and Repealing Rules

- 1 Relating to rules concerning uniform premium lists and class
2 requirements for exhibits at county and district fairs.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture
Trade and Consumer Protection

Section 93.23, Wis. Stats., entitled "Local Fairs," provides authority for prescribing conditions for allocating and distributing state aid to counties and agriculture societies, associations or boards conducting local fairs. Pursuant to this authority, the department has adopted Chapter Ag 5, Wis. Adm. Code, which sets forth requirements for classes of exhibits which will be approved for the purposes of state aid, premium awards in such classes and entry qualifications, fees and charges for exhibitors. From time to time, on the advice and recommendation of interested groups such as the Wisconsin Association of County and District Fairs, this chapter has been revised and amended to bring various provisions and premium classes into conformance with the trends that are taking place in the exhibit arena. Recently state and national dairy cattle breed associations approved a change in the base dates for the age of exhibited dairy cattle. Currently the age base dates for individual classes are January 1 or July 1. The new base dates are moved closer to the fair exhibit time to reduce the incidence of senior yearlings which have calved from being shown in the 2-year-old class as required in section Ag 5.03(1)(a)4. A younger senior yearling heifer is less likely to have calved under the proposed age base dates. Since the age requirement for the junior calf class is changed to animals born on or after March 1 of the exhibit year and which are at least 4 months old at the time of exhibit, it is unlikely there will be many entries in this class at most local fairs. The senior calf class is therefore subdivided into 2 classes identified as "senior intermediate calf" and "senior calf." The age base dates are December 1 and September 1 of the year preceding the exhibit year for each class respectively. The Wisconsin Association of County and District Fairs, along with the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association and the respective dairy cattle breed associations, have endorsed the amendment of Chapter Ag 5 to reflect the new classes and base dates for both the open division and junior fair division.

1 Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin
2 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection by sections
3 93.07(1) and 93.23, Wis. Stats., the department proposes to amend
4 and adopt rules interpreting section 93.23, Wis. Stats., as
5 follows:

6 SECTION 1. Ag 5.02(8) and 5.03(1)(a)1 are amended to read:

7 Ag 5.02(8) Special educational exhibits may be instituted if
8 presented to the Wisconsin association of fairs prior to October 1
9 of the year preceding the fair year, and such exhibits are approved
10 by the department of agriculture.

11 Ag 5.03(1)(a) 1. A junior calf is one born on or after
12 January March 1 of the exhibit year. The calf shall be at least 4
13 months old at the time of exhibit.

14 SECTION 2. Ag 5.03(1)(a)2 to 8 are renumbered 5.03(1)(a) 3 to
15 9 respectively and as renumbered are amended to read:

16 Ag 5.03(1)(a)3. A senior calf is one born during the period
17 July September 1 to December-31 November 30 of the year preceding
18 the exhibit year.

19 4. A junior yearling is one born during the period January
20 March 1 to June-30 August 31 of the year preceding the exhibit
21 year.

22 5. A senior yearling is one born during the period July
23 September 1 to December-31 of the second year preceding the exhibit
24 year to February 28 or 29 of the year preceding the exhibit year.

25 If a senior yearling has calved, it shall be shown in the 2-year-
26 old class.

1 6. A 2-year-old is one born during the period July Septem-
2 ber 1 of the third year preceding the exhibit year to June-30
3 August 31 of the second year preceding the exhibit year, and shall
4 include senior yearlings which have freshened.

5 7. A 3-year-old is one born during the period July Septem-
6 ber 1 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year to June-30
7 August 31 of the third year preceding the exhibit year.

8 8. A 4-year-old is one born during the period July Septem-
9 ber 1 of the fifth year preceding the exhibit year to June-30
10 August 31 of the fourth year preceding the exhibit year.

11 9. A 5-year-old is one born before July September 1 of the
12 fifth year preceding the exhibit year.

13 SECTION 3. Ag 5.03(1)(a)2 is adopted to read:

14 Ag 5.03(1)(a)2. A senior intermediate calf is one born during
15 the period December 1 of the year preceding the exhibit year to
16 February 28 or 29 of the exhibit year.

17 SECTION 4. Ag 5.03(3)(a) is amended to read:

18 Ag 5.03(3)(a). "Department" as it relates to the organization
19 or structure of fairs, means an animal species, production group or
20 other principal subdivision of a fair. As used elsewhere, it means
21 the state of Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and
22 consumer protection.

23 SECTION 5. Ag 5.04(1) is amended to read:
