

# ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOAFD AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of amending s. NR 45.10(1);
repealing and recreating s. NR 45.20; and
creating s. NR 45.17(3)(z) of the Wisconsin
Administrative Code pertaining to state
parks and forests use regulations

#### Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The proposed rules would provide for the use of horses to remove forest products from state parks and southern forests by permit, waive the admission sticker at the Potawatomi State Park ski hill during the winter and allow special events to be conducted by the State Historical Society on Department lands at historic sites operated by the Society.

The proposed rules are needed to help facilitate the management and operation of state parks and southern forests. The use of horses is presently restricted to marked trails in state parks and southern forests by rule. Private individuals have requested permission to use horses to remove fuelwood. The proposal would permit such use of horses by permit.

The Potawatomi ski hill is now operated by a private non-profit corporation under a long-term lease. Ski lift ticket prices will be adjusted to help compensate for the sticker waiver.

The State Historical Society has requested permission to hold special events that simulate historical activities on Department lands.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 23.09, 23.11(1), 27.01(2)(j), 227.014 and 227.02(1)(e), Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends, repeals and recreates, and creates rules interpreting ss. 23.09(2), 23.11(1), 27.01 (2)(j) and 27.01(2r)(b)5., Stats., as follows:

#### SECTION 1 - Section NR 45.10 (1) is amended to read:

(1) It-shall-be-unlawful-for-any No person to may ride, lead or cause or-suffer a horse to be in any state park, fish hatchery, the Bong recreation

area, the Sugar River state trail or the Kettle Moraine or Point Beach state forests except on specifically designated and posted areas or bridle paths, or by permit on field trial areas or when specified in a permit to remove forest products.

SECTION 2 - Section NR 45.17 (3) (z) is created to read:

(z) Potawatomi state park ski hill between November 1 and March 31 each year.

SECTION 3 - Section NR 45.20 is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 45.20 EXCEPTIONS. (1) Nothing in this chapter prohibits or hinders the department of natural resources, its supervisors, managers, foresters, wardens, rangers, or other duly authorized agents, or any peace officer from performing their official duties.

(2) Upon written application by the director of the state historical society, or designee, the department may waive specific rules for special events conducted by the society at historic sites on department lands operated by the society.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on May 27, 1981.

The rules contained herein shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026 (1)(intro.), Stats.
