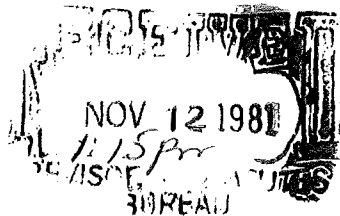




TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

1 ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN
2 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, TRADE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

3 ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

4 Relating to rules concerning definition of the term "official
5 vaccinate" as it pertains to brucellosis vaccination of female
6 bovine animals.

Analysis Prepared by the
Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

The existing definition of "official vaccinate" in section Ag 10.01(23) is repealed and recreated and a new section Ag 10.195 is adopted to narrow the definition in several respects. One change will permit official vaccination to be done only by an accredited veterinarian instead of by a licensed veterinarian as under the current rule. Under the national brucellosis control program of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, vaccination can only be done by an accredited veterinarian. Accreditation is granted by the animal and plant health inspection service of USDA. This change is made in order to retain Wisconsin's status as a brucellosis-free state in inter and intrastate cattle movement. A second change in the proposed rule is the identification of strain 19 brucella vaccine as the only brucellosis vaccine approved by the department for the official vaccination of calves. In addition to the vaccination of young calves under the current rule, an alternative method for vaccination of older calves by use of a reduced dose of strain 19 vaccine is provided in the proposal. Bovine calves of any dairy or beef breed between 120 and 299 days of age may be vaccinated by using the lower dose vaccine.

7 Pursuant to authority vested in the state of Wisconsin depart-
8 ment of agriculture, trade and consumer protection by sections
9 93.07(1), 95.001, 95.26(6) and 95.46(2), Wis. Stats., the state of
10 Wisconsin department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection
11 amends and adopts rules interpreting sections 93.07(10), 95.001,
12 95.26 and 95.46, Wis. Stats., as follows:

13 SECTION 1. Ag 10.01(23) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code
14 is repealed and recreated to read:

1 Ag 10.01(23) "Official vaccinate" means a female bovine
2 animal which has been vaccinated and is officially identified and
3 reported to the department as having been vaccinated against
4 brucellosis in accordance with the requirements of s. 95.46,
5 Stats. . and this chapter.

6 SECTION 2. Ag 10.195 is created to read:

7 Ag 10.195 Brucellosis vaccination; official vaccinates.

8 (1) No bovine animals may be vaccinated against brucellosis or
9 officially reported or identified as having been vaccinated against
10 brucellosis unless vaccinated by an accredited veterinarian with an
11 approved strain 19 brucella vaccine within age ranges and corres-
12 ponding dosages specified under pars. (a) to (c) for animals of
13 dairy and beef breeds.

14 (a) Dairy breed animals vaccinated between 60 and 179 days of
15 age with a strain 19 standard dose vaccine containing a minimum of
16 25 billion live brucella cells.

17 (b) Beef breed animals vaccinated between 60 and 299 days of
18 age with a strain 19 standard dose vaccine containing a minimum of
19 25 billion live brucella cells.

20 (c) Bovine animals of either a dairy or beef breed when
21 vaccinated between 120 and 299 days of age with a strain 19 dose
22 vaccine containing not more than 4 billion live brucella cells.

23 (2) To be classified as official vaccinates, animals
24 vaccinated as required under sub. (1) shall be identified as
25 required under s. Ag 10.21(2), Wis. Adm. Code, and officially
26 reported to the department as having been vaccinated as required
27 under s. 95.46(4), Stats.

1 The rules and amendments contained in this order shall take
2 effect on the first day of the month following publication in the
3 Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.026(1),
4 Stats.
