ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

1 Relating to rules concerning egg grade and quality standards 2 and permit fees for the Wisconsin AA fresh fancy quality grade 3

egg program.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

The current egg grade and quality standards in Chapter Ag 90 were adopted in 1974. Adoption of the rule coincided with passage of the shell egg surveillance law by Congress. Rules implementing the shell egg inspection and grading program and establishing federal egg grade and quality standards were then adopted by U.S.D.A.

The federal standards have recently been revised by U.S.D.A. with an effective date of October 1, 1981. It is therefore necessary to make two amendments to Ag 90 to reflect the changes in the federal standards for egg grades.

The first proposed amendment is for the elimination of the Grade C designation in section Ag 90.03. The rule provides for the continuation of Grades AA, A and B. Eggs formerly classified as Grade C will now be classified as either Grade B or restricted, This change coincides with the new federal dirty and checked. standards.

The second change is in section Ag 90.04 and provides for continuation of the Grade AA Fresh Fancy Quality Program with an increase in the fee structure to finance the cost of the program. The proposed fee of \$60 per permit holder is intended to cover the full cost of the program and is based on information presently available. Under the revised federal standards, the Grade AA Fresh Fancy Quality Program has been eliminated, but after checking with the present permit holders in this state, it is proposed that Wisconsin retain the program but increase fees to finance its cost.

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Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection by sections 93.07(1) and 93.09, Wis. Stats., the State of Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection
