



## ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES REPEALING RULES

To repeal H 1 relating to pleading, practice and procedure in administrative proceedings before the State Board of Health.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services:

Chapter H 1, Wis. Adm. Code, was promulgated in 1963 by the State Board of Health under the authority of s. 227.08, Stats. (1961). The Department of Health and Social Services inherited the chapter in 1968 when the Board and two other state agencies were transferred into the newly established Department. The Department no longer uses ch. H 1, Wis. Adm. Code.

The content of the chapter deals with matters ranging from the format for written requests for hearings, to the procedure for applying for hospital construction aid, to the time of hearings (which is tied to monthly meetings of the Board), to licensure matters. Most of the provisions that could still apply to Department proceedings have been superseded by procedural provisions in statutes and rules relating to specific programs. Examples include the certificate of need review and appeal processes in ch. 150, Stats., and ch. H 3, Wis. Adm. Code, and the Medical Assistance review and appeal processes in ss. HSS 104.01 and HSS 106.10, Wis. Adm. Code. The remaining relevant matters in ch. H 1, Wis. Adm. Code, are adequately covered under the administrative hearing provisions of ch. 227, Stats. Retention of ch. H 1, Wis. Adm. Code, serves no purpose.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Health and Social Services by s. 227.014(2), Stats., the Department proposes to repeal rules interpreting s. 227.08, Stats. (1961), as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter H 1 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Rules repealed by this order are repealed effective the first day of the month following publication of notice of repeal in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.026(1), Stats.
