ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION ADOPTING RULES

Revisor of Statutes Bureau

Relating to Rules concerning Use of State Buildings and Facilities.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Administration:

Section 16.843(2), Stats., authorizes the department to establish rules relating to parking of motor vehicles on the grounds of any of the state office buildings. Section Adm 2.09(1)(e), regulates parking of bicycles, mopeds, motor bicycles, and motor-driven cycles in designated parking stalls or bicycle racks on state property. State-owned three-wheeled cycles are specifically exempt from the regulations due to their daily use by state employes in the performance of tasks relating to operations of state buildings and grounds. The amendment to section Adm 2.13 (2)(a) is needed to provide consistency with the wording in Adm 2.13(2)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code. Section Adm 2.15 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed because the penalty for violation of rules of conduct is provided in Adm 2.13(2), Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Administration by ss. 16.004, 16.84(1), and 16.843(2), Stats., the Department hereby repeals, amends, and adopts rules interpreting s. 16.843(2), Stats., as follows:

Section Adm 2.15 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section Adm 2.13(2)(a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Adm 2.13(2)(a) Pessesses <u>Without a permit, possesses</u> an open container which contains an alcoholic beverage on the grounds or in public areas of those buildings and properties designated in Adm 2.02(1) and (2).

Section Adm 2.09(1)(e) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is adopted to read:

Adm 2.09(1)(e) No parking of bicycles as defined in s. 340.01(5), Stats., mopeds as defined in s. 340.01(29m), Stats., motor bicycles as defined in s. 340.01(30), Stats., and motor-driven cycles as defined in s. 340.01(33), Stats., shall be permitted on or in those properties and buildings enumerated in Adm 2.02(1) and (2), except in designated parking stalls or bicycle racks. State-owned three-wheeled cycles are exempt from the provision of this section. The rules, amendments, and repeals contained in this order shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1)(intro), Stats.
