

**Chapter PB 1****INVESTIGATIONS**

PB 1.01 Scope of investigations  
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**Note:** Chapter PB 4 as it existed on June 30, 1982 was repealed and a new chapter PB 1 was created effective July 1, 1982.

**PB 1.01 Scope of investigations.** (1) **STATUTORY AUTHORITY.** Pursuant to s. 230.07 (4), Stats., the board may make investigations, on its own motion or upon request, with respect to all matters concerning the enforcement or effect of the civil service law, subch. II, ch. 230, Stats., and the rules of the administrator. If the investigation discloses that the administrator, appointing authority, or any other person acted illegally or to circumvent the intent and spirit of the law, the board may issue an enforceable order to remand the action to the administrator or appointing authority for appropriate action within the law.

(2) **LIMITATIONS.** The board shall not investigate or hear any matter within the exclusive jurisdiction of another person or body, including without limitation because of enumeration, a court, the personnel commission, the employment relations commission, or an arbitrator under a collective bargaining agreement. The board shall not order specific individual relief where it appears that the legislature intended that no such individual relief should be granted.

**PB 1.02 Requests for investigations.** (1) **CONTENT.** Requests for investigations shall be in writing, shall identify the agency or person sought to be investigated and the reason an investigation is requested.

(2) **FILING.** Requests for investigations shall be filed at the office of the Personnel Board, 149 East Wilson Street, Madison, Wisconsin 53702.

**PB 1.03 Responses.** Prior to deciding whether to initiate an investigation, the board may request a response, in writing or otherwise, from the agency or person sought to be investigated.

**PB 1.04 Conduct of investigations.** The board may utilize any formal or informal means of investigation, including interviews, requests for information, hearings, and the examination of public records.
