ORDER OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION
AMENDMENT, ADOPTING AND REPEALING RULES

Relating to rules of ch. PSC 2 concerning procedure and
repealing rules made obsolete by statutory changes. To repeal
and recreate sec. PSC 2.40; to renumber sec. PSC 2.01(3); to
amend secs. PSC 2.01(1), 2.01(2) and 2.62; to create sec. PSC
2.01(3), Wis. Adm. Code.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE
COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN

The Public Service Commission proposes to amend a
number of rules in ch. PSC 2, Wis. Adm. Code, to update that
chapter. The changes are entirely procedural and do not require
a hearing. These changes include: (1) updating and address to
which documents should be sent to the commission within a post
office box, (2) changing the designation of the person to whom
documents should be sent from "executive secretary" to
"secretary", (3) requiring titles and docket numbers on
communications, and (4) providing certain information for
judicial review of commission orders. Other changes bring the
rules into line with changes in statutes, such as allowing 30
days for rehearing deliberations rather than the previous 20.

PROPOSED RULES AND STATUTORY AUTHORITY

Pursuant to authority vested in the Public Service Commission by secs. 196.02(3) and 227.02(1)(a), Stats., the Public Service Commission amends, repeals and adopts rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Sec. PSC 2.01(1), Wis. Adm. Code is amended

to read:

COMMUNICATIONS AND DOCUMENTS ADDRESSED TO COMMISSION. (1) All written communications and documents ~~should~~ shall be addressed to Public Service Commission of Wisconsin, Hill Farms State Office Building, 4802 Sheboygan Avenue, P. O. Box 7854, Madison, Wisconsin 53702 53707, and not to individual members of the staff. All communications and documents delivered at the office of the ~~executive~~ secretary are officially received.

Section 2. Sec. PSC 2.01(2), Wis. Adm. Code is amended

to read:

The ~~executive~~ secretary may designate agents to receive written communications and documents. Presiding officers will receive communications and documents at hearings.

SECTION 3. Sec. PSC 2.01(3) is renumbered sec.

2.01(4), Wis. Adm. Code.

SECTION 4. Sec. 2.01(3), Wis. Adm. Code, is created to

read:

The first page of all communications and documents shall contain a distinctive title identifying the action requested, and a docket number, if one exists.

SECTION 5. Sec. PSC 2.40, Wis. Adm. Code, is repealed and recreated to read:

REQUIREMENTS FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW. Petitions for judicial review must be filed within 30 days after the day of service of a commission decision - or denial of rehearing - in the circuit court specified in sec. 227.16(1)(a) Stats., and served on the commission and other parties to the proceeding, as specified in the statute. A list of the parties who must be served will be contained in the decision if there is more than one party to the proceeding.


SECTION 6. Sec. PSC 2.62, Wis. Adm. Code, is amended to read:

DENIAL OF APPLICATIONS BY LAPSE OF TIME. Any application for rehearing not granted within ~~20~~ 30 days from the date of its filing shall be taken by the applicant to have been denied. (s. 227.12(5), Stats.)

There will be no fiscal impact of these proposed rules on the state or municipalities. If the commission approves the proposed amendments, they will take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in sec. 227.026, Stats.
