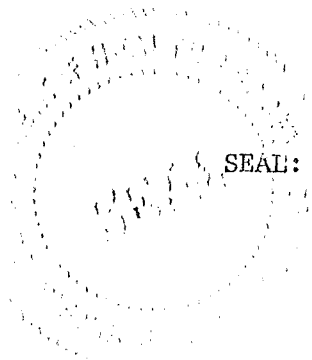

ORDER OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES  
REPEALING RULES

To repeal H 101, relating to notice of the lead content in gasoline.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services:

Chapter H 101, Wis. Adm. Code, was promulgated in 1963 or earlier by the State Board of Health under the general authority of s. 140.05(1) and (3), Stats. The Department of Health and Social Services inherited the chapter in 1968 when the Board and two other state agencies were transferred into the newly established Department.

This chapter was intended to protect the public from health-endangering misuse of leaded gasoline. It requires signs on gas pumps at service stations, provides for leaflets to be distributed by service station employes that warn of threats to health in the use of ethyl gasoline for purposes other than to fuel motor vehicles, and requires warning labels on containers of leaded gasoline sold to consumers.

The chapter is not now used or enforced by the Department because Federal and state statutes, regulations and rules have superseded H 101. The Federal Environmental Protection Agency has jurisdiction over signs on gas pumps under 40 CFR 80.22(e)(2). The State Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations requires labels on containers under s. 168.11, Stats., and ss. IND 8.14, 8.40 and 10.10, Wis. Adm. Code.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Health and Social Services by s. 140.05(3), Stats., the Department proposes to repeal rules interpreting s. 140.05(1), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter H 101 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Rules repealed by this order are repealed effective the first day of the month following publication of notice of repeal in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.026(1), Stats.
