IN THE MATTER OF repealing s. NR 10.01(4)(a)5.; amending s. NR 10.01(3)(b) (title) and (e)1.a. and b. and (em) and (4)(a)2., 10.116(5), 10.22(2)(title) and (a), and (b)3.a. and b.; repealing and recreating s. NR 10.01(3)(e)9.e.; and creating ss. NR 10.001(22) and 10.01(3)(bm) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to 1982 hunting regulations

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The proposed rule revisions:

- 1) Establish the 1982 deer quotas under the hunters choice permit system. The 70,285 quota is an approximate 8.5% increase over 1981.
 - 2) Authorize the use of rifles for deer hunting in Door County.
- 3) Establish an antlerless or spike buck bag limit for bow and gun deer hunting on Chambers Island, Door County.
- 4) Establish a general hunting framework authority on the Sandhill Experimental Wildlife Area.
- .5) Delete the Winnebago Zone for trapping muskrat and mink. This area is placed in the Central Zone.
- 6) Establish the hunting season for raccoon 2 weeks earlier for residents than for nonresidents.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 23.09(2), 23.11, 29.085, 29.108, 29.174 and 227.014, Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals, amends, and repeals and recreates rules interpreting ss. 23.09(2) (intro.) and (2)(k), 23.11, 29.085, 29.108 and 29.174(2) and (14), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 10.001(22) is created to read:

(22) "Unforked antler" means a polished antler consisting of a single spike without branches or times.

SECTION 2. NR 10.01(3)(b)(title) is amended to read:

(b)(title) Raccoon (resident hunting and trapping)

SECTION 3. NR 10.01(3)(bm) is created to read:

Kind of animal and locality	Open season (both dates inclusive)	Limit
(bm) Raccoon (nonresident hunting) In all counties of the state	Beginning on the Satur- day nearest October 29 and continuing through January 31.	None

SECTION 4. NR 10.01(3)(e)1.a. and b. and (em) are amended to read:

a. In the counties or parts of counties of Brown, Buffalo (north of U.S. highway 10), Calumet, Chippewa (south of state highway 64 and west of U.S. highway 53), Dane (west of state highway 78 and north of U.S. highway 18), Dodge, Door (Washington, Detroit, Plum and Rock Islands), Dunn (south of state highway 64), Fond du Lac, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Outagamie, Pepin (north of U.S. highway 10), Pierce (north of U.S. highway 10), St. Croix (south of state highway 64), Sheboygan, Shawano (south of state highway 29), Waupaca and Winnebago.

Shotgun season

Beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 9 consecutive days

One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length or hunter's choice permit limit

b. All other parts of Zone "A"

Firearm season

Beginning on Saturday immediately preceding Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 9 consecutive days

One hunter's choice permit deer or one buck deer per season with an antler than 3 inches in length or permit-limit, except on Chambers island in Door county where the limit shall be one buck deer with an unforked antler or one deer by hunter's choice permit.

(em) Deer (Bow and arrow season)
There shall be an open season
for hunting deer with bow
and arrow in all counties of
the state

Beginning on the
3rd Saturday in
September and
continuing through
the Sunday immediately
prior to the opening of
the deer gun season

One deer per season either sex, except on Chambers island in Door county where the limit shall be one buck deer with an unforked antler or one antlerless deer.

Beginning on the Saturday immediately following the close of the gun deer season through December 31

One deer per season either sex, except on Chambers
Island in Door county where the limit shall be one buck deer with an unforked antler or one antlerless deer.

SECTION 6. NR 10.01(4)(a)2. is amended to read:

2. All that part of the state lying south of state highway 64 and north of the line beginning at the junctions of U.S. highway 18 with the western boundary of the state, then east along said highway 18 to its junction with U.S. highway 51, then north along said highway 51 to its junction with state highway 60, then east along said highway 60 to its junction with Ozaukee county highway "Q" extended east to Lake Michigan except-that-part-of Dodge-county-lying-northerly-of state-highway-60,-and-Fond-du-Lac, Outagamie-Waupaea,-Waushara-and Winnebago-counties

Beginning on the Saturday None nearest November 1 and continuing through December 31

SECTION 7. NR 10.01(4)(a)5. is repealed.

SECTION 8. NR 10.116(5) is amended to read:

(5) BAG LIMIT. Such The permit shall authorize the use of the holder's current Wisconsin deer hunting license and <u>carcass</u> tag for one deer of any age or sex in the quota area designated on the permit <u>except on Chambers island in Door county where the bag limit shall be one antlerless deer or one buck deer with an unforked antler.</u>

SECTION 9. NR 10.22(2)(title) and (a) are amended to read:

(2) HUNTING. (a) Except for the first 2-days <u>day</u> of deer hunting, daily hunting permits shall be issued to hunters at established check stations on a first-come, first-served basis on the day for which the permit is to be issued. Such-permits <u>Permits</u> shall be issued without charge for-the-purpose of-conducting-research-on-hunting-methods-and-success. It-shall-be-unlawful to <u>No person may</u> hunt on such area without a permit.

SECTION 10. NR 10.22(2)(b)3.a. and b. are amended to read:

- a. One hunting period shall be established beginning on the Saturday one week preceding the regular statewide gun deer season opening and continuing for-5-consecutive-days-or until such time during-the-5-day-period when approximately 80 140 animals have been registered.
- b. Permits for the first 2-days day shall be issued by the department to persons who are in possession of a valid Wisconsin deer hunting license and duly applying by mailed application which-must-be postmarked no later than the first Friday in October.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on June 24, 1982.

The rules contained herein shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.
