ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

1 Relating to rules concerning requirements for certification  
2 and recertification of mink herds as Aleutian disease free.

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Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture,  
Trade and Consumer Protection

Aleutian disease is a viral disease affecting mink and is characterized by chronic weight loss, poor reproduction and eventual death due to kidney failure. There is no known treatment or vaccine available to deal with the disease; however, mink are the only animals affected. The voluntary program allows eligible mink ranchers to have their herds certified as Aleutian disease free, which is a great aid to ranchers in the purchase and sale of breeding stock.

The proposed amendments will allow greater flexibility in scheduling tests to coincide with good herd management practices. The change will also allow recertification using a smaller representative sample of a previously clean herd. The smaller sample will not alter the ability to reveal a diseased herd.

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3 Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin  
4 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection by  
5 sections 93.07(1) and (10), Wis. Stats., the State of Wisconsin  
6 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection adopts  
7 rules interpreting sections 95.16 and 95.18, Wis. Stats., as  
8 follows:

9 SECTION 1. Ag 10.60(1) and (4)(a) are amended to read:  
10 Ag 10.60 ALEUTIAN DISEASE FREE HERD. (1) QUALIFYING FOR  
11 CERTIFICATE. To qualify a herd of mink as an Aleutian disease  
12 free herd and for a certificate evidencing such status, the herd  
13 owner shall file with the Department proof that all mink in the  
14 breeder herd have passed two successive counterelectrophoresis

1 counterimmuno-electrophoresis (CEP) plate tests without evidence of  
 2 infection. Such tests must be conducted at a state approved  
 3 laboratory not less than ~~45~~-days 60 nor more than 365 395 days  
 4 apart.


5 (4) RECERTIFICATION. (a) The department may recertify the  
 6 status of any certified Aleutian disease free herd for an  
 7 additional periods period of one year, provided the herd passes a  
 8 negative CEP or other approved test of all mink males and 10% of  
 9 all females in the herd not more than 90 days after the expiration  
 10 date of the certificate. ~~After the second consecutive certifica-~~  
 11 ~~tion, a herd may be recertified by testing at least 50% of the~~  
 12 ~~mink of each color phase, but including all of the males of each~~  
 13 ~~color phase.~~

14 The rules and amendments contained in this order shall take  
 15 effect on the first day of the month following publication in the  
 16 Wisconsin administrative register, as provided in section  
 17 227.026(1), Stats.
