ORDER OF STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

CREATING RULES

.....

IN THE MATTER of creating s. NR 26.01(11)(b) and (33)(a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code to establish year-round fish refuges on Lake Wyona, Columbia county and Yellowstone Lake, Lafayette county

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

This rule establishes year-round fish refuges in Lake Wyona, Columbia county and Yellowstone Lake in Lafayette county. Fry and fingerling game fish will be stocked in these lakes beginning in the fall of 1983. Closure to fishing through implementation of fish refuges will allow the smaller game fish to grow without being subject to angler creel or hooking mortality.

Yellowstone Lake is being drawn down in preparation for a fall chemical treatment to eradicate rough fish and reestablish a viable sport fishery. In addition to the fry and fingerling, largemouth bass brood stock will be stocked in the spring of 1984. The fish refuge for Yellowstone Lake will be in effect until June 15, 1985, allowing the brood stock to spawn twice before fishing is allowed.

Lake Wyona suffered a dam washout and is now refilled and efforts are being made to reestablish a sport fishery. The fish refuge will be in effect until the first Saturday in May, 1985.

Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 29.174, 227.014(2)(a) and 227.02(1)(e), Stats., the Natural Resources Board hereby creates rules interpreting ss. 23.09(2)(c) and 29.174, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 26.01(11)(b) is created to read:

NR 26.01(11)(b) Lake Wyona. That lake known as Lake Wyona including the dam located in the village of Wyocena upstream to the East Bush road on the inflowing north branch of Duck creek, section 14, township 12 north, range 10 east and upstream to the dam at "Figor's millpond" upstream from Twitchell road, section 23, township 12 north, range 10 east on the middle branch of Duck creek. This refuge is to remain in effect to, but not including the first Saturday in May, 1985.

SECTION 2. NR 26.01(33)(a) is created to read:

NR 26.01(33)(a) Yellowstone lake. That lake known as Yellowstone lake including the water from the Yellowstone lake dam located in E $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, section 1, township 3 north, range 4 east upstream to the CTH F bridge crossing the Yellowstone river in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, section 35, township 4 north, range 4 east and the CTH F bridge on Steiner branch creek in NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, section 34, township 4 north, range 4 east, Lafayette county. This refuge is to remain in effect through June 14, 1985.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on January 25, 1984.

The rules contained herein shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1) (intro.), Stats.

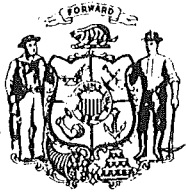


