ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN LAKE MICHIGAN
COMMERCIAL FISHING BOARD RENUMBERING,
AMENDING AND CREATING RULES.

IN THE MATTER of renumbering s. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c.;
amending s. NR 25.07(2)(a)1.b.; and creating
s. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c. of the Wisconsin Administra-
tive Code pertaining to the allocation of the
commercial chub harvest in Lake Michigan.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

The renumbering of s. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c., Wis. Adm. Code, is necessary to provide room for created s. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c., Wis. Adm. Code, and to maintain a logical sequence in these rules.

The amendment to s. NR 25.07(2)(a)1.b., Wis. Adm. Code, clarifies the intent of that rule, that the 35 foot or longer boat owned by the chub permit applicant is to be used in their chub fishing under the permit.

The creation of s. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c., Wis. Adm. Code, limits the amount of chubs that may be harvested from any single boat in the southern chub fishing zone in a license year to the amount of one maximum individual allotted quota. The one quota applies even if the license is transferred to a different boat.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Lake Michigan Commercial Fishing Board by s. 29.33(7), Stats., the State of Wisconsin Lake Michigan Commercial Fishing Board hereby renumbers, amends and creates rules interpreting s. 29.33, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 25.07(2)(a)1.b. is amended to read:

NR 25.07(2)(a)1.b. Ownership of a boat 35 feet in overall length or longer which shall be used by the applicant in fishing under their chub permit;

SECTION 2. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c. is renumbered 25.07(2)(a)3.d.

SECTION 3. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c. is created to read:

NR 25.07(2)(a)3.c. No more than the amount of one maximum individual quota allotted under subpar. a.1) and 2) may be taken on any one boat in the southern chub zone during the license year. If it is necessary to transfer a chub fishing permit to another boat, this limit shall be applied in total on the boats involved.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Lake Michigan Commercial Fishing Board on January 12, 1984.

The foregoing rules were approved by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on February 22, 1984.

The rules contained herein shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.

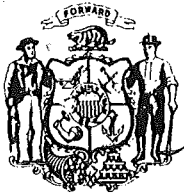
