

ORDER OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES  
AMENDING RULES

To amend HSS 62.01(3)(p) and (r), relating to standards for the assessment of drivers of motor vehicles whose use of alcohol or controlled substances has interfered or threatens to interfere with their driving, and for the development and completion of driver safety plans for these drivers.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services

The definitions for "program provider" and "treatment program" in ch. HSS 62, recently promulgated rules for the assessment of motor vehicle drivers who have alcohol or drug abuse problems, include wrong cross-references to other rules. Both definitions reference ss. HSS 61.50 to 61.58 whereas they should reference ss. HSS 61.50 to 61.68. In consequence, 8 types of program providers and treatment programs are inadvertently omitted from coverage by these definitions. This order corrects those cross-references.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Health and Social Services by ss. 343.30(1q)(c) and 343.305(9)(c), Stats., the Department of Health and Social Services hereby amends rules interpreting ss. 343.30(1q)(c) and (d) and 343.305(9)(c) and (d), Stats., as follows:


SECTION 1. HSS 62.01(3)(p) and (r) are amended to read:

HSS 62.01(3)(p) "Program provider" means a public or private treatment facility meeting alcohol and drug abuse program standards and approved by the department under s. 51.45(8)(a) and (c), Stats., and ss. HSS 61.50 to ~~61.58~~ 61.68; a traffic safety school approved by the department of transportation; or an out-of-state treatment facility authorized by the board staff.

(r) "Treatment program" means an alcohol and drug abuse program approved by the department under ss. HSS 61.50 to ~~61.58~~ 61.68, or an equivalent program in another state authorized by a board and providing one or more of the types of care and services listed in ss. 51.42(5) and (5m) and 51.45(2)(g) and (7), Stats., directed toward promoting effective personal and social adjustment and functioning or ameliorating a client's dependency problem.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.026(1), Stats.


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Dear Mr. Prestegard:
