Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

General summary of rule. Section 85.30, Wisconsin Statutes, requires the Wisconsin department of transportation to develop and administer a motor-driven cycle, moped and motor bicycle safety program including skills, safety and public awareness elements. The statute authorizes grants for the program and requires the department of transportation to adopt administrative rules implementing the program.

To implement the program, the department of transportation has adopted chapter Trans 503, <u>Wisconsin Administrative Code</u>. Among other things, that rule provides that VTAE districts, school districts and municipal units of government shall be reimbursed for a portion of the expenses they incur in conducting the basic riding courses. The existing rule limits reimbursement to 60% of actual course cost. This rule amendment changes the reimbursement limit from 60% to 70% of actual course cost. This increased reimbursement percentage is necessary to encourage VTAE districts, school districts and municipal governmental units to offer this needed safety program.

Fiscal estimate. This rule change will increase the percentage of riding course costs that the department of transportation can reimburse from 60% to 70%. The 1983 reimbursement total, calculated at 60% of course costs, was \$34,777.66. If that reimbursement had been calculated at 70% of course cost, the department would have reimbursed an additional \$5,796.30. Hence, if course reimbursement requests for future years remain comparable to those of the past, the department's expenditures will increase by \$5,000.00 to \$6,000.00 as a consequence of this rule amendment. Meanwhile, total VTAE district, school district and municipal government expenditures and student fees for the program will decrease by the same amount.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Wisconsin department of transportation by s. 85.30, Stats., the department of transportation proposes rules interpreting s. 85.30, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section Trans 503.04(4)(c), Wisconsin Administrative Code, is amended to read:

Trans 503.04(4)(c) Reimbursement under this subsection may not exceed 60 70% of the actual course cost. No reimbursement may be provided under this subsection for a course for which the students are required to pay more than 40% of the actual course costs. Reimbursement may not exceed an amount equal to actual course cost less the amount students are required to pay.

[Note: The intent of this subsection is that courses be funded 70% by state money and 30% by student fees to encourage student commitment.]
