HEA 2.01 Definitions

Note: Chapter HEA 2 as it existed on March 31, 1978 was repealed and a new chapter HEA 2 was created effective April 1, 1978.

HEA 2.01 Definitions. In chapters HEA 1 to 6:

(1) "Satisfactory academic progress" means that level of academic performance, as defined by the institution in which the student is enrolled, which is normally required to insure adequate progress toward the attainment of the appropriate degree or certificate. The institution's decision to continue to enroll or not enroll a student should be based exclusively on academic criteria unrelated to the awarding of financial aid. Once the decision has been made by the institution that a student remains eligible for continued enrollment, that student shall remain eligible for financial aid provided by state programs. At no time shall any more strict criteria be applied to any student receiving state funds administered by the board than that required of any enrolled student not receiving financial aids.

(2) "Nonprofit" means a governmental agency, subdivision of government, school district, vocational school district or similar body and any agency, organization or institution owned and operated by one or more nonprofit corporations or associations, no part of the net earnings of which inures, or may lawfully inure, to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual.

(3) "Tuition" means all tuition and instruction related fees charged by the institution.

(4) "Instruction related fees" means all fees directly related to instruction in the classroom and which are charged to all students within a recognizable academic program category.

(5) "Independent or self-supporting student" means a student who meets the currently used federal definition of independent or self-supporting student.
