ORDER

Pursuant to authority vested in the Medical Examining Board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.014 and 448.40, Stats., the Medical Examining Board hereby amends, creates and adopts rules, interpreting ss. 448.05(6) and 448.40, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. Med 1.06(5) is created to read:

Med 1.06(5) Any applicant who is a graduate of a medical school in which English is not the primary language of communication may be examined by the board on his or her proficiency in the English language.

SECTION 2. Med 6.06(6) is created to read:

Med 6.05(6) Any applicant who is a graduate of a school in podiatry in which English is not the primary language of communication may be examined by the board on his or her proficiency in the English language.

SECTION 3. Med 7.04(5) is created to read:

Med 7.04(5) Any applicant who is a graduate of a school in a program in physical therapy in which English is not the primary language of communication may be examined by the board on his or her proficiency in the English language.

The rules amended, created and adopted in the order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026, Stats.
