

ANALYSIS OF PROPOSED RULES

The Division of Safety and Buildings within the department is responsible for adopting and enforcing rules relative to the safety requirements of machines and boilers in places of employment and public buildings under section 101.17 of the Wisconsin statutes. The proposed rules contain removal of installation registration fees for boilers, pressure vessels, power piping systems and mechanical refrigeration systems, and include new installation notification requirements for boilers and pressure vessels through the National Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Inspectors. The proposed rules contain an exemption from periodic inspections for small air receivers. The proposed rules also contain the adoption by reference of the 1983 ASME and ANSI B31.1 standards.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by ss. 101.02 (1), 101.02 (15) (h) to (j), 101.17 and 101.19 (1), Stats., the department hereby repeals, renumbers, amends, repeals and recreates, and creates rules interpreting ss. 101.17 and 101.19 (1), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. ILHR 41.015 is amended to read:

ILHR 41.015 PETITION FOR MODIFICATION VARIANCE. The department will consider and may grant modification a variance to any administrative rule upon receipt of a fee and a completed petition for modification variance form from the owner, provided an equivalency is established in the petition for modification variance which meets the intent of the rule being petitioned. The department may impose specific conditions in the petition for modification variance to promote the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the employes or the public. Violation of those conditions under which the petition for modification variance is granted constitutes a violation of these rules.

Note #1: Copies of the petition for modification variance form (SB-8) are available at no charge from the Division of Safety and Buildings, P.O. Box 7969, Madison, Wisconsin 53707.

Note #2: Section 101.02 (6), Stats., outlines the procedure for submitting petitions to the department and the department's procedures for hearing petitions.

Note #3: See ch. Ind 69 for fee requirements.

SECTION 4. ILHR 41.21 (1) (1) is created to read:

ILHR 41.21 (1) (1) Air receivers having a volume of less than 12 cubic feet and an operating pressure of less than 250 psig.

SECTION 5. ILHR 41.50 is amended to read:

ILHR 41.50 ASME CODE VESSELS. (1) ASME CODE COMPLIANCE. Except as regulated in ss. ILHR 41.51, 41.52 and 41.53, boilers and pressure vessels installed after the effective date of this section shall be constructed and installed in accordance with the ASME standards adopted under s. ILHR 41.10. Electric boilers shall be constructed and installed in accordance with ASME section I and IV as applicable.

Note: The department will recognize the applicable "case interpretations" of the ASME boiler and pressure vessel code as being acceptable.

(2) FILING WITH NATIONAL BOARD. Boilers and pressure vessels constructed and installed in accordance with the ASME standards adopted in s. ILHR 41.10 and manufactured after the effective date of this subsection shall have the manufacturer's data report filed with the National Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Inspectors and shall bear a National Board number.

SECTION 6. ILHR 41.51 (1) (intro.) is amended to read:

ILHR 41.51 WISCONSIN SPECIAL VESSELS. (1) Where it is not possible or practical to construct a boiler or pressure vessel in strict compliance with s. ILHR 41.50, the department may grant a modification variance to the owner or user to permit the installation of the vessel as a Wisconsin special within the state of Wisconsin. The department will consider a modification variance request upon receipt of a completed petition for modification variance form and the required fee. The modification variance may be granted under the following conditions:

SECTION 7. Ind 69.03 (5) and (6) are repealed.

(Note: These subsections establish a registration fee for the installation of boilers, pressure vessels and power piping systems.)

SECTION 8. Ind 69.03 (7), (8) and (9) are renumbered (5), (6) and (7).

SECTION 9. Ind 69.04 (3) is repealed.

(Note: This subsection establishes a registration fee for the installation of mechanical refrigeration systems.)
