

ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT
OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
AMENDING RULES

1 To amend PI 3.07(7)(a)2a and PI 3.07(7)(a)3a, relating to the reading
2 teacher and reading specialist license.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Public Instruction

The proposed rules interpreting s. 115.28(7), Stats., will delay the effective date of the new reading teacher and reading specialist certification requirements until July 1, 1985. The requirements for obtaining the reading teacher and the reading specialist license were originally scheduled to change as of July 1, 1984. However, the universities have been unable to implement the program changes within the nine months since the original rule order was filed. Consequently, those students graduating in 1984 and applying for certification as a reading teacher or reading specialist after July 1, 1984, have not completed the necessary coursework under the new certification rules. Implementation of this rule as of July 1, 1984, would mean students would probably have to spend additional time in school in order to meet the new requirements. The change of the effective date to July 1, 1985, will give universities ample time to implement the program changes and will give students ample time to complete the necessary coursework.

3 Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Superintendent of Public



Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The delay of the effective date of the new reading teacher and reading specialist certification requirements from July 1, 1984 to July 1, 1985 will provide an extra year for the teacher education institutions to make the necessary program changes. The fiscal note filed with the original rule order (CHR 83-40) indicated that the program changes required under the new certification requirements might affect a teacher training institution inadequately staffed to handle the course requirements. Such an institution could adjust to the new certification rules by reallocating resources. This delay in the implementation of the new requirements will certainly prove helpful to those institutions.

In addition, the delay in implementation of these rules will impact students seeking reading teacher and reading specialist certification in 1984. The program these students are presently completing will enable them to meet the current certification requirements. However, the inability of some of the teacher training institutions to make the adjustment in their programs to meet the new certification requirements means that some students will not have completed the necessary coursework for the new certification requirements. Without a delay in the effective date of the new requirements these students might incur additional tuition costs and/or be unable to secure employment in their chosen fields. Delay will benefit both the teacher training institutions and the students currently enrolled in the program.
