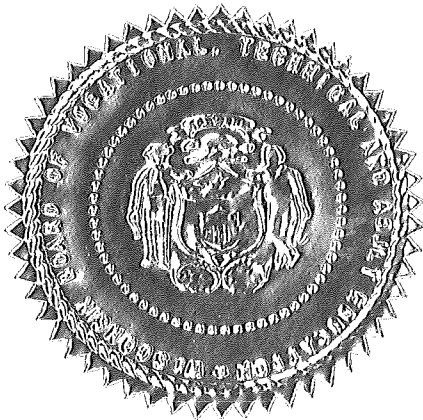

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF VOCATIONAL,
TECHNICAL AND ADULT EDUCATION ADOPTING
RULES RELATING TO THE VOCATIONAL EDUCATION
INSTRUCTOR OCCUPATIONAL COMPETENCY PROGRAM

To adopt Chapter A-V 11, Wis. Admin. Code, relating to the vocational education instructor occupational competency program.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE BOARD OF VOCATIONAL, TECHNICAL AND ADULT
EDUCATION

Section 38.32, Stats., as created by 1983 Wisconsin Act 370, creates the vocational education occupational competency program which is designed to provide vocational education instructors in vocational, technical and adult education districts and public high schools with temporary work experiences in business and industry in order to improve their knowledges and skills in the subjects they teach. This program is to be jointly established by the Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education and the Department of Public Instruction, and the Board, in conjunction with the Department, is to promulgate rules that implement and administer the program. As a result, the Board, and the Department, will be adopting substantially identical rules to implement this program.

Grants awarded under this program are, to the extent possible, required to be distributed equally on a statewide basis. Furthermore, no person employed by a business or industry participating in the program may be terminated from employment, laid-off or otherwise displaced as a result of the business or industry participating in the program, and no grant may be awarded to a vocational, technical and adult education district that conflicts with a collective bargaining agreement. Grants awarded are to be used to partially pay the salaries of teachers participating in the program, and the grant award is to be matched with local district funds.

Grant application procedures, criteria for awarding grants and conditions of the grant, are all areas of concern in the proper administration of this program. This rule establishes needed regulations in these areas.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult Education by sections 38.32(4) and 227.014(2)(a), Stats., the Board of Vocational, Technical and Adult education hereby adopts rules interpreting section 38.32, Stats., as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter A-V 11 of the Wisconsin
2 Administrative Code is created to read:

5 A-V 11.01 PURPOSE AND APPLICATION. The purpose of this
6 chapter is to establish policies and procedures and to
7 administratively interpret s. 38.32, Stats., relating to the
8 vocational education instructor occupational competency program
9 to be established by the board. This chapter is adopted pursuant
10 to s. 38.32(4) , Stats.

11 NOTE: Forms used in administering this rule are available

16 A-V 11.02 DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

17 (1) "Board" means the board of vocational, technical and
18 adult education.

19 (2) "Director" means the person appointed by the board under
20 s. 38.04(2), Stats.

21 (3) "District" means a vocational, technical and adult
22 education district.

23 (4) "District board" means the district board in charge of
24 the vocational, technical and adult education schools of a
25 district.

1 (5) "District director" means the person employed by a
2 district pursuant to s. 38.12(3), Stats.

3 (6) "Program" means the vocational education instructor
4 occupational competency program established by the board under
5 s.38.32, Stats.

6 (7) "Vocational education instructor" means a person
7 certified by the board to teach vocational subjects under
8 ch. A-V 3, and who has entered into a teaching contract with a
9 district.

10

11 A-V 11.03 GENERAL. (1) The program shall be designed
12 to provide district vocational education instructors with
13 temporary work experience in business and industry in order to
14 improve their knowledge and skills in the subjects they teach.

15 (2) To the extent possible, grants awarded under the program
16 shall be equally distributed on a statewide basis.

17 (3) No person employed by a business or industry
18 participating in this program may be terminated from employment,
19 laid-off or otherwise displaced as a result of that business or
20 industry participating in the program.

21 (4) No grant may be awarded to any district board that
22 conflicts with a collective bargaining agreement.

23

24 A-V 11.04 GRANT APPLICATIONS. (1) Districts shall
25 disseminate information to vocational education instructors

1 informing them of the program.

2 (2) A vocational education instructor desiring to
3 participate in the program shall inform his or her district
4 director of his or her intent to be considered for funding under
5 the program. Participation in the program shall be voluntary on
6 the part of the vocational education instructor and the district
7 board.

8 (3) If the district board determines that the vocational
9 education instructor should be allowed to participate in the
10 program it may file an application for a grant.

11 (4) The application for a grant shall be on forms prescribed
12 by the board and shall be filed with the board.

13 NOTE: Form VE-AS-259 Occupational Competency Program Grant
14 Application.

15

16 A-V 11.05 GRANT AWARDS. (1) Grant awards for
17 vocational education instructors employed by districts shall be
18 made by the director or the director's designee to the district
19 employing the vocational education instructor.

20 (2) In determining whether a grant award will be made, based
21 upon a particular grant application, the following criteria shall
22 be applied:

23 (a) The potential for improved instruction resulting from
24 participation in the program.

25 (b) The need for upgrading the vocational education

1 instructor's skills after considering technological advances in
2 the subject area taught by that person.

3 (c) The number of grant awards and the amount of funds
4 awarded to that district for vocational education instructors.

5 (d) The availability of funds.

6

7 A-V 11.06 CONDITIONS OF THE GRANT AWARD. (1) Each
8 business or industry participating in the program shall certify
9 that no person employed by that business or industry will be
10 terminated from employment, laid-off or otherwise displaced as a
11 result of that business or industry participating in the program.

12 (2) Grant awards under the program shall only be used to
13 partially pay the salaries and fringe benefits of vocational
14 education instructors participating in the program.

15 (3) Any grant award received by a district board shall, at a
16 minimum, be equally matched by the district board.

17 (4) Each vocational education instructor shall, within 60
18 days of completion of participation in the program and on forms
19 provided by the board, submit a written evaluation to the board
20 and his or her district board describing the work experience
21 received and the specific applications that the work experience
22 will have to the instructor's teaching assignment.

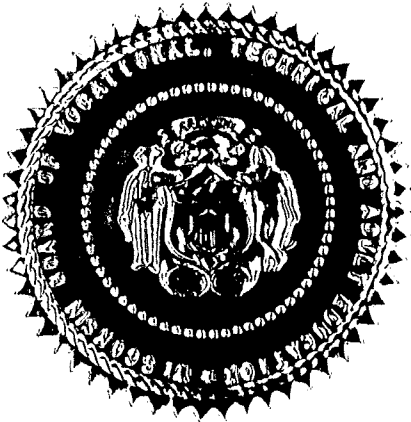
23 (5) Prior to September 15, and on forms provided by the
24 board, each participating district, and business and industry
25 shall evaluate its participation in the program and forward a

1 copy of this evaluation to the board.

2 NOTE: Form VE-AS-260(a) Instructor Evaluation, Form VE-AS-
3 260(c) District Evaluation and Form VE-AS-260(b) Business and
4 Industry Evaluation.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect as provided
in s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.
