## Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

SUMMARY OF RULE. In December of 1982, Congress enacted sections 411 to 413 of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 (Pub. L. 97-424, 96 Stat. 2097) and Section 321 of the Department of Transportation Appropriations Act (Pub. L. 97-369). On February 3, 1983, the U.S. Department of Transportation initiated a rule interpreting these laws. 48 Fed. Reg. 5210-5212.

These laws and rules made several significant changes with respect to federal provisions governing the length, width, and combination of certain vehicles using the Interstate and other qualifying highways. The vehicles involved are truck tractors, semitrailers, trailers, double bottoms, these vehicles when operated by household goods carriers, and automobile haulaways. For the first time, the authority of states to limit the lengths, widths, and combinations of these vehicles is now controlled at the federal level. On November 17, 1983, 1983 Wisconsin Act 78 became effective, implementing these provisions in Wisconsin.
I. DESIGNATED QUALIFYING HIGHWAYS

The Wisconsin Secretary of Transportation is required by 1983 Wisconsin Act 78 to designate the qualifying highways on which the vehicles with the new federally regulated minimum dimension limits may operate, and the designation may not be inconsistent with the designation made by the U.S. Secretary of Transportation. The U.S. Department of Transportation promulgated an administrative rule for purposes of an initial designation of highways in 48 Fed. Reg. 5210-5212 (February 3, 1983). That federal rule designated the following as qualifying highways:

The Interstate System and those sections of the Federal-aid Primary System which are divided highways with 4 or more lanes and full control of access will be eligible for use by vehicles whose dimensions are established by [federal law], except where the State can justify that such use is not in the public interest, such as on parkways or other routes where truck traffic is currently prohibited. Additionally, the State may designate other Federal-aid Primary

System Highways that comply with safety and operational requirements, such as traffic lanes designed to be at least 12 feet wide and bridges structurally capable of accommodating the allowable loads.

In Wisconsin, there are 33 divided highway segments with 4 or more lanes and full control of access that were eligible for use by vehicles whose minimum length limits are established by federal law. Chapter TRANS 350, Wis. Admin. Code, published on March 17, 1983, identified and designated these qualifying highways, effective April 6, 1983.

In addition, there were 10 other highway segments that had already been designated by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation as authorized double bottom routes and 2 additional short segments that qualified for designation under then current Wisconsin law, sec. $348.27(6)$, Stats., and Wis. Admin. Code $\$$ Hy $30.20(4)$. The reason for this broader Wisconsin designation was that Wisconsin had no statutory requirement for full control of access or that the 4-lane highway be divided to qualify. Therefore, Wis. Admin. Code Chapter TRANS 350, published on March 17, 1983, identified and designated these highways as qualifying highways for use by vehicles and combinations of vehicles whose lengths, by federal law, cannot be limited by Wisconsin.
II. EXPANDED FEDERAL DESIGNATION

On March 31, 1983, the U.S. Department of Transportation abandoned its initial designation of four-lane divided highways with full control of access and designated as qualifying highways about four times as many highway miles in Wisconsin, including many two-lane highways. This new U.S. Department of Transportation designation was published in the Federal Register on April 5, 1983, effective April 6, 1983 (23 CFR Ch. 1 [FHWA Docket No. 83-4, Notice No. 3]). The substantial expansion made by the U.S. Department of Transportation in the highways designated in Wisconsin and the timing of its official publication required the amendment and republication of Wis. Admin. Code Chapter Trans 350 as an emergency rule. On May 3, 1983, 48 Fed. Reg. 20022, the U.S. Department of Transportation published a revised interim designation which modified the highway system designated in the April 6 rule. The May 3 revision contained a net reduction of approximately 900 miles for Wisconsin.
III. FURTHER FEDERAL DESIGNATION

Under federal law, the U.S. Secretary of Transportation was to make a final designation of highways by October 3, 1983. On September 14, 1983, the Federal Highway Administration published a Notice of Proposed Rule Making in the Federal

Register, Volume 148, Number 179. The final federal rule was published on June 5, 1984, and was substantially similar to the September 14, 1983, Notice. Trans 276 is intended to implement both 1983 Wisconsin Act 78 and the Federal Highway Administration's June 5, 1984, final rule which created 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 658. The Department's rule is a final codification of the system which has been in effect for over a year (Trans 350) plus additions to that system authorized by sec. 348.074 , Stats. That provision allows the secretary to add routes after considering "safety, economics, energy savings, industry productivity, and competition." Using this criteria, the secretary has added additional highways. The rule also clarifies other provisions of the size and weight statutes and portions of the federal rule.

FISCAL ESTIMATE. This rule may result in a decrease in potential litigation for any improper enforcement of Wisconsin vehicle length or combination limits in violation of the preemptive federal law. The rule also serves to obviate any potential loss of federal highway aid. It provides uniform guidance for the continued enforcement of Wisconsin vehicle maximum dimension and combination laws.

FINAL REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ANALYSIS. This rule does not affect small business other than to give such businesses increased access to their facilities by vehicles with lengths authorized by federal and state law.

Pursuant to authority vested in the department of transportation by ss. $110.06(1)$ and $348.07(4)$, Stats., the department of transportation hereby adopts rules interpreting certain provisions of chs. 340 and 348 , Stats., to comply with federal law as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter TRANS 276 is created to read:
CHAPTER TRANS 276
DESIGNATED HIGHWAYS FOR VEHICLE LENGTH AND COMBINATIONS

TRANS 276.01 GENERAL. (1) SCOPE OF CHAPTER. This chapter identifies and designates a list of qualifying highways for the operation of vehicles and combinations of vehicles the overall lengths of which cannot be limited. In addition, this chapter clarifies other statutory provisions or federal rules affecting the width and length of vehicles and combination of vehicles and the number of vehicles in combination.
(2) POLICY. This policy is intended to permit Wisconsin to comply with federal law, to provide guidance to vehicle users and law enforcement authorities for safe and lawful operations, and to continue the reasonable enforcement of Wisconsin vehicle size and combination laws.

TRANS 276.02 DEFINITIONS. In this chapter words and phrases have the meanings designated in s. 340.01, Stats. and Ch. 250, Wis. Admin. Code, unless a different meaning is expressly provided in this chapter.

TRANS 276.03 SAFETY DEVICES-WIDTH EXCLUSION. (1) The devices in this subsection are designated as safety devices as required under 23 C.F.R. $658.5(\mathrm{~g})$ and 23 C.F.R. 658.15 and are not included in the calculation of width:
(a) rear-view mirrors;
(b) turn-signal lamps;
(c) hand-holds for cab entry and egress;
(d) splash and spray suppressant devices;
(e) load induced tire bulge.
(2) The devices in this subsection are determined to be safety devices and are not to be included in the calculation of
width provided such devices do not extend beyond 3 inches on each side of a vehicle.
(a) Door hardware, including door handles and locking devices.
(b) Load tie down devices.
(c) Toe holds or retractable steps.
[Note: The 3 -inch limit is imposed by 23 C.F.R. 658.15. The Secretary is authorized to designate additional devices in s. $348.05(2 \mathrm{~m})$, Stats.]

TRANS 276.04 WIDTH, METRIC EQUIVALENT. For purposes of enforcement of chapter 348 , Stats., 23 C.F.R. 658, and this chapter, the approximate metric equivalent of 102 inches is deemed to be within the 102 limit of s. 348.05 , Stats. The approximate metric equivalent of 102 inches is 2.6 meters, which equals approximately 102.36 inches.
[Note: The use of the metric equivalent of 102 inches is authorized in 23 C.F.R. 658.15.]

TRANS 276.05 AUTOMOBILE HAULAWAYS. For enforcement purposes: (1) The provision of s. $348.07(2)(\mathrm{g})$, Stats., which limits the length of a trailer or semitrailer in a 2 -vehicle combination to 48 feet does not apply to an automobile haulaway provided the automobile haulaway does not exceed 66 feet in length plus the authorized front and rear overhangs. This subsection applies to both designated and non-designated highways.
(2) An automobile haulaway exceeding 66 feet in length may operate on designated highways and 5-mile access routes provided the trailer or semitrailer portion of the combination does not exceed 48 feet plus authorized rear overhang.

COMBINATION. For enforcement purposes, no permit is required for vehicles operating in double saddlemount combination provided the overall length of the combination is 65 feet or less in length. This section applies to designated highways and 5 -mile access routes.
[Note: The provision of Wisconsin law requiring a permit for these combinations (s. 348.27(13), Stats., was preempted by the federal rule (23 C.F.R. 658.13 (d) 3.1 ) when these vehicles operate on the designated system and access routes.]
