

ORDER OF THE  
DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION  
ADOPTING RULES

Relating to: Veteran's Day ceremonies in the state capitol building or grounds.

Analysis by the Department of Administration:

In November 1983, Representative Schneider wrote the Commander of VFW Post 1318 in Madison about Veteran's Day ceremonies in the state Capitol building. Representative Schneider also contacted the Joint Committee for the Review of Administrative Rules about the inability of veterans groups to conduct activities in the building during business hours on November 11.

At the suggestion of the JCRAR, a rule is being created permitting observances on November 11 in the state Capitol building or on the state Capitol park grounds, by veterans organizations, to commemorate the end of hostilities in the nation's wars.

The proposed rule will have no adverse effect on small businesses.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Administration by ss. 16.004(1) and 16.84, Stats., the Department of Administration hereby adopts rules interpreting s. 16.84 (11), Stats., as follows:

Section Adm 2.04 (8) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

(a) The department of administration shall grant a permit to any organization filing a written request to hold a ceremony in the state capitol building or on the state capitol park grounds on veteran's day, November 11, for the purpose of commemorating the end of hostilities in the nation's wars. If more than one organization applies for a permit, requests submitted by veterans' organizations identified in ch. 188, or s. 15.497, stats., shall be given preference. If more than one veterans organization applies for a permit, then the requests shall be processed and the permits granted in the order received. Notwithstanding any provision of this subsection, the Madison veterans council shall have first priority if it applies for a permit.


(b) The permit shall be issued for any period requested, including business hours, but not to exceed 2 hours. No 2 veterans organizations may be granted permits for the same time period except for organizations conducting joint ceremonies.

(c) A ceremony under this section may include a band or an orchestra, but may not include the discharge of firearms inside the state capitol building.

The rule contained in this order shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1) (intro.), Stats.
