ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD RENUMBERING, AMENDING, RENUMBERING AND AMENDING, REPEALING AND AMENDING, RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER OF renumbering ss. NR 10.01(4)(a) 3. and 4.; amending ss. NR 10.01(4)(a)2., 10.02(1), 10.101(3)(b) and 10.116(5); renumbering and amending s. NR 10.01(3)(e)1.e.; repealing and recreating ss. NR 10.01(4)(e), 10.28 and 11.09(intro.); and creating ss. NR 10.01(3)(e) 1.e. and f., 10.01(4)(a)3. and 10.01(4)(dm) pertaining to regulation modifications for the 1985 hunting and trapping seasons.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

- 1. <u>Muskrat/Mink Seasons</u> Re-establish a 6-county season zone for trapping muskrat and mink beginning on the Saturday nearest October 28 through March 15. This season framework provides unique, late winter trapping opportunities and provides harvest of muskrats normally lost due to freeze-out conditions.
- 2. Apostle Island Deer Hunting Elimination of the rifle, shotgun and bow deer hunting on the islands (20) off of Ashland and Bayfield counties and establishment of an early (October 1-31) deer hunt confined to muzzle-loading firearms. Federal and state authorities desire to offer a type of hunting experience more in tune with the primitive environment provided by these undeveloped islands and consistent with needs expressed by hunters using muzzle-loaders.
- 3. Furbearer Trapping The closed area within 2 state-owned properties prohibits all trapping to protect beaver and otter. Restricting the closed area coverage to beaver and otter will accomplish the management objectives while providing trapping opportunities on other species.
- 4. Chambers Island Deer Hunting Allow the taking of forked antlered deer in Deer Management Unit 82 (Chambers Island). Forked bucks have been protected in this unit since 1982 to encourage buck antler growth for a future trophy hunt. Research objectives require implementation in 1985.
- 5. Deer Season Option Establish a buck with Hunter's Choice Permit deer season on certain federal lands located in Pool 4, Mississippi River bottomlands. Current season constraints do not provide for a liberal antlerless deer harvest and is increasing the herd along with the crop damage potential.

6. Fisher Season - Establish an 11-day fisher trapping season to provide recreational harvest of about 300 wild fisher. A permit system will be used within 3 management zones comprised of 17 trapping units administered similar to otter trapping. The season bag limit of one fisher requires the fisher carcass to be retained by the department. The carcass will be used for research purposes.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 23.09(2)(intro.) and (k), 29.085, 29.174(1), 29.225 and 227.014(2)(a), Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby renumbers, amends, renumbers and amends, repeals and recreates, and creates rules interpreting ss. 23.09(2)(k), 29.085, 29.174(1) and 29.225 Stats., as follows:

SECTION 7. NR 10.01(4)(e) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 10.01(4)(e) Recording of fisher and otter. 1. 'Tagging and permits'. a. No person may trap or attempt to trap any fisher or otter unless having first applied for and received from the department a trapping permit and tag or tags authorizing such trapping.

- b. Applications for permits and tags shall be received by the department no later than the first Friday in October each year.
- c. If the number of applications for fisher permits exceeds the number available in subd. 2, successful applicants shall be determined by random selection.
- d. The trapper shall attach the permit to his or her trapping license before trapping any fisher or otter.
- e. Each permit shall be numbered to correspond to the applicant's current trapping license and show the applicant's name and tag numbers.
- f. No person may apply for more than one fisher permit or one otter permit.
- 2. 'Permit quota'. The department shall issue the following numbers of permits for the 1985 fisher trapping season:
 - a. Management zone A 100.
 - b. Management zone B 125.
 - c. Management zone C 75.

- 3. 'Tagging procedure'. a. Each person shall immediately upon possessing a fisher or an otter, attach and lock a valid tag, issued by the department, through the opening of the mouth to the opening of the eye, immediately beneath the skin.
- b. No person may have a fisher or an otter pelt in possession or under control unless the person trapping the animal attaches the tag as required by this subdivision.
- c. The tag shall remain attached to the pelt until removed by a fur dresser or taxidermist at time of preparation.
- 4. 'Fisher exhibition'. Unless otherwise authorized by the department, each person who has trapped a fisher shall exhibit the pelt separated from the carcass along with the carcass to an authorized department representative in the management unit in which the animal was trapped, or in an adjoining unit, no later than 5 days after the close of the fisher season. The fisher carcass shall be retained by the department.
- 5. 'Otter exhibition'. Each person who has trapped an otter shall exhibit each pelt to an authorized department representative in the county in which the animal was trapped, or in an adjoining county, but within the area open to otter trapping, no later than 5 days after the close of the otter season.
- 6. 'Registration'. The department shall inspect the pelt, attach and lock a registration tag to the head of all lawfully taken and possessed fisher and otter.
- 7. 'Possession and transfer restrictions'. No person may: a. Possess raw fisher or otter pelts later than 5 days after the close of the fisher and otter seasons to the opening date of the following fisher and otter seasons without a registration tag attached and locked to the head of the animal.

b. Transfer, give, trade, sell or purchase any fisher or otter pelt without a registration tag being attached and locked to the head of the pelt.

SECTION 8. NR 10.02(1) is amended to read:

NR 10.02(1) Cougar, badger, moose, elk, fisher, wolverine and flying squirrel.

SECTION 9. NR 10.101(3)(b) is amended to read:

NR 10.101(3)(b) <u>Training</u>. The training of dogs by pursuing <u>wild</u> bear is prohibited except during-the-period-of July 10 through August 20 31.


Note: Bear dog trials and training are regulated by ch. NR 17.

SECTION 10. NR 10.116(5) is amended to read:

NR 10.116(5) BAG LIMIT. The permit shall authorize the use of the holder's current Wisconsin deer hunting license and carcass tag for one deer of any age or sex in the quota area designated on the permit except on Chambers island in Door county where the bag limit shall be one antierless deer er-ene-buck-deer-with-an-unferked-antier of the type determined by random selection and indicated on the permit.

SECTION 11. NR 10.28 is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 10.28 DEER MANAGEMENT UNITS. Deer management units are established as designated on the following map.



SECTION 12. NR 11.09(intro.) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 11.09 BEAVER/OTTER CLOSED AREA. A closed season is established in the following areas posted with department signs. No person may trap beaver or otter thereon at any time.
