OF THE

STATE ELECTIONS BOARD

To repeal ElBd 1.12 relating to the requirement of candidates to file campaign finance reports in special elections.

Analysis Prepared by State Elections Board

This rule interprets ss. 8.50 (5) and 11.20 (3), Stats., that requires candidates in special elections to file campaign finance reports as specified in s. 11.20 (3), Stats. Before this rule was adopted by the board effective August 1, 1977, the legislature had not enacted any statute to detail the requirements to file such finance reports. After the adoption of this rule, however, the legislature enacted in 1979, s. 11.20 (3)(a), (b), (c), (d), and (e), Stats., that details the campaign finance report filing requirements. This statute, therefore, supercedes this rule. This rule now serves no useful public purpose.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin elections board by s. 227.014 (2)(a), Stats., the elections board hereby repeals its rule interpreting ss. 8.50 (5) and 11.20 (3), Stats., as follows:

Section 1. ElBd 1.12 is repealed.

The repeal of this rule takes effect on the first day of the month following its publication in the Wisconsin administrative register under s. 227.026 (1)(intro.), Stats.

This letter informs you about the status of the proposed repeal of ElBd 1.12 about filing campaign finance reports in special elections.


