ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
AMENDING, AND REPEALING AND RECREATING RULES

 IN THE MATTER OF amending s. NR 10.01(2)(f) .
 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining .
 to regulation modifications for the 1986 wild .
 turkey season. .

Analysis Prepared by the
Department of Natural Resources

1. Turkey Hunting Season - The current 3-week formula for the annual turkey hunting season begins on Thursday and ends on Monday. Modifying the rules to a Wednesday-Sunday formula would be more convenient to hunters because their vacation days would involve only one week's pay period instead of two.
2. Turkey Hunting Permits - The number of turkey hunting permits controls the turkey harvest and hunting pressure in 7 Wild Turkey Hunting Zones for 3 separate hunting periods. The Department proposes to increase the number of permits to be issued for the 1986 hunting season by 570 based upon the experience obtained during the 1985 season. In 1985, 2,175 permits were issued and 497 wild turkeys were harvested.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 29.103, 29.174(2)(b) and 227.02(1)(e), Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends, and repeals and recreates rules interpreting s. 29.103, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 10.01(2)(f) is amended to read:

1. Zones 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 9 and 10 as described in s. NR 10.29 are open zones. Zones 6, 7 and 8 are closed zones.	Beginning on the <u>Thursday</u> nearest <u>Wednesday</u> April 21 and continuing <u>Thursday</u> <u>Wednesday</u> through <u>Monday</u> <u>Sunday</u> for 3 consecutive time periods shown in subd. 2.	One male or bearded turkey per season by permit.

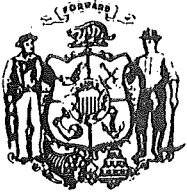


