AN ORDER to repeal Phar 4.03(3) and 4.05(2) to (4); to renumber Phar 4.05(5) to (7); to renumber and amend Phar 4.03(4); and, to repeal and recreate Phar 4.05(1), relating to pharmacist licensure by examination.

Analysis prepared by the department of regulation and licensing.

ANALYSIS

By June, 1986, the professional pharmacy practice examination administered by the pharmacy examining board to applicants for license as pharmacists will be reorganized in a substantially different format. As a result of the reorganization of the examination, the following revisions are made in current rules:

1. Sections Phar 4.03(3) and 4.05(2) to (4) are repealed and s. Phar 4.05(1) is repealed and recreated to eliminate provisions on the professional pharmacy practice examination administered prior to June 1, 1986. Section Phar 4.05(1) as repealed and recreated specifies that applicants who failed the professional practice examination prior to June 1, 1986 must take and pass that examination as administered on or after June 1, 1986.
2. Section Phar 4.03(4) is renumbered and amended to specify that an applicant for license must pass by at least a score of 75.0 all examinations listed in s. Phar 4.02.
3. Certain provisions in ss. Phar 4.03 and 4.05 are renumbered to place the rules in numeric sequence following repeal of obsolete provisions in those sections.

The rules revised in this proposal interpret s. 450.02(1) and (2), Stats., relating to examination requirements.

ORDER

Pursuant to authority vested in the pharmacy examining board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.014(2)(a) and 450.02(1) and (2), Stats., the pharmacy examining board hereby repeals, amends and recreates rules, interpreting s. 450.02(1) and (2), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. Phar 4.03(3) is repealed.

SECTION 2. Phar 4.03(4) is renumbered 4.03(3) and amended to read:

Phar 4.03(3) An applicant shall achieve a score of no less than 75.0 on each of the examinations specified in s. Phar 4.02~~(1)~~ ~~to~~ ~~(4)~~.

SECTION 3. Phar 4.05(1) is repealed and recreated to read:

Phar 4.05(1) An applicant who, prior to June 1, 1986, failed to pass NABPLEX in its entirety shall take and pass NABPLEX as administered on or after June 1, 1986 in order to obtain a license.


SECTION 4. Phar 4.05(2) to (4) are repealed.

SECTION 5. Phar 4.05(5) to (7) are renumbered 4.05(2) to (4).

The rules revised in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.
