### Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

- 1. Permit application deadlines are standardized for uniformity purposes.
- 2. Deer gun season frameworks for zones "B" and "F" and recodified for clarity and to correct rule oversights for Pepin and Pierce counties, certain state parks and unit 61C.
- 3. Special bow deer hunting restrictions for Chambers Island are eliminated responding to local support for creating forked buck hunting opportunities equal to gun hunter privileges. This resolves problems identified during 1985 legislative hearings.
- 4. Clarifying definitions and titles are created.
- 5. Type of game restriction authority is clarified for the Sandhill Wildlife Demonstration Area.
- 6. Fisher trapping restrictions are clarified by using county registration rather than units.
- 7. Trap placement restrictions are standardized at 15 feet from beaver houses and dams. Using 50 feet at certain times of year serves no useful purpose and is confusing to trappers.
- 8. Closed areas and refuges are modified or created in Adams, Brown, Clark, Fond du Lac, and Marathon counties. Local public support has been obtained.

- 9. Scientific collector restrictions are clarified.
- 10. The canoe campsite definition and motor vehicle use on state lands are clarified.

NR 19.001(2m) "Environmental consulting organization" means an individual or consortium of individuals funded to provide consulting services including status assessment of wild animals and their habitats.

SECTION 26. NR 19.11(2)(c) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 19.11(2)(c) <u>Licenses</u>. A person is not required to possess a separate hunting, fishing or trapping license while collecting under a scientific collector permit.

SECTION 27. NR 19.11(3)(a)9. is created to read:

NR 19.11(3)(a)9. The period of the permit.

SECTION 28. NR 19.11(4)(c)3. is amended to read:

NR 19.11(4)(c)3. Federal permits. <u>a. State permit required</u>. Permits involving the capture, marking, collection, possession or salvage of migratory birds or parts, nests or eggs of migratory birds will not be issued <u>under this</u> <u>section</u> until the applicant possesses a permit issued by the U.S. fish and wildlife service for that activity.

NR 19.11(7) <u>Disposition</u>. Specimens collected under the authority of the scientific collector permit may be transferred to and possessed by an educational institution for exhibition or education purposes upon completion of the project or expiration of the permit. Environmental consulting organizations may retain specimens following permit expiration provided the specimens are marked in a manner prescribed by the department. An educational institution or environmental consulting organization possessing specimens shall possess written proof of source, including the scientific collector permit number of the source and present that proof upon request by the department.

SECTION 32. NR 45.03(2) to (17) are renumbered NR 45.03(3) to (17) and (19), respectively, and NR 45.03(10) and 45.03(16) as renumbered are amended to read:

NR 45.03(10) "Canoe campsite" means a campsite along a waterway for use by persons traveling exclusively by water watercraft.

(16) "Off-road motorcycle" means a motor vehicle not more than 45 inches in overall width designed to travel on not more than 3 2 wheels in contact with the ground transporting a maximum of 2 people, having an unaltered U.S. forest service approved spark-arrester muffler emitting a sound level not to exceed 102 decibels (dba) measured at a distance of 20 inches from the exhaust outlet at an engine speed one-half of red line. The microphone shall be at an angle of  $45^{\circ} \pm 10^{\circ}$  from the vertical plane through the exhaust system centerline. SECTION 33. NR 45.03(2) is created to read:

NR 45.03(2) "All-terrain vehicle" has the meaning specified in s. 340.01(2g), Stats.

SECTION 34. NR 45.03(18) is created to read:

NR 45.03(18) "Snowmobile" has the meaning specified in s. 340.01(58a), Stats., and is considered to be a vehicle for the purposes of this chapter.

SECTION 35. NR 45.05(3) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 45.05(3) RECREATIONAL VEHICLE OPERATION. (a) <u>Posted notices</u>. Except as provided, no vehicle may be operated on lands and waters under the supervision, management or control of the department unless its use is specifically authorized by posted notice.

(b) <u>Snowmobile races</u>. No person may conduct or engage in snowmobile races on any lands under the supervision, management or control of the department.

(c) <u>Speed limits</u>. No person operating a vehicle may violate the posted speed limit.

(d) <u>Disabled persons</u>. A motorized golf cart or similar means of conveyance may be used by disabled persons as a mode of personal conveyance by special permit obtained from the property superintendent. No permit is required for a motorized wheel chair operated by a disabled person.

(e) <u>Bicycles</u>. Bicycles may be operated on department lands unless their use is prohibited by posted notice.

NR 45.11(9) Air boats may not be operated on lands and waters under the supervision, management or control of the department unless their use is specifically authorized by posted notice.
