ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

In THE MATTER of repealing s. NR 20.06(1)(b)

42. and 64.; renumbering s. NR 20.04(3)(am) 26.;
amending ss. NR 20.06(1)(b)(intro.),
20.09(2)(g), 20.12(5)(a) and 21.12(a) and 22.12(1);
repealing and recreating ss. NR 20.01, 20.04(3)(am)
3. and 24; and creating s. NR 20.04(3)(a) 11. and
(am) 26. of the Wisconsin Administrative Code
pertaining to fishing regulation housekeeping changes
for 1986.

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The rules are promulgated under the authority of ss. 29.174(3), 227.11(2)(a) and 227.16(2)(e), Stats., and interpret s. 29.174(2), Stats.

The proposed rules are nonsubstantive changes in the fishing regulations. The specific changes are:

- 1. Repealing unnecessary references to crayfish and frog regulations.
- 2. Clarifying the extended open fishing season on Lake Columbia, Columbia County.
- 3. Clarifying the extended open fishing season areas on the Chippewa River, Wisconsin River and Yellow River.
- 4. Clarifying that motor trolling is not permitted on Lake Mohawksin, Lincoln County.
- 5. Repealing inconsistent rules allowing motor trolling on the Monroe County Flowage, Monroe County and Smoky Lake, Vilas County, since NR 23 prohibits motor trolling on Wisconsin-Michigan boundary waters and NR 45 prohibits the use of motors on the Monroe County Flowage.
- 6. Clarifying that there is no minimum hook size requirement on setlines fished on the Wisconsin-Minnesota and Wisconsin-Iowa boundary waters of the Mississippi River.

SECTION 1. NR 20.01 is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 20.01 PURPOSE; GENERAL RESTRICTION. Seasons, bag limits, possession limits and other regulations for fishing in Wisconsin waters are established in this chapter. No person may take, catch, kill or fish for fish of any

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variety in excess of the daily bag limit, by means other than hook and line, during other than the open season or possess or control any fish in excess of the possession limit or below the minimum size limit, except as expressly provided in this chapter.

SECTION 2. NR 20.04(3)(a)11. is created to read:

NR 20.04(3)(a)11. Columbia County - Columbia

SECTION 3. NR 20.04(3)(am) 3. and 24. are repealed and recreated to read:

NR 20.04(3)(am)3. Chippewa river including all sloughs, bayous and flowages from the Holcombe dam in Chippewa county downstream to the Burlington Northern railroad bridge in Buffalo and Pepin counties, and streams flowing into this part of the Chippewa river from their mouths up to the first highway or railroad bridge.

24. Wisconsin river including all sloughs, bayous and flowages from the St. Regis dam in Rhinelander, Oneida county, downstream to the Burlington Northern railroad bridge in Crawford and Grant counties and streams in Columbia county flowing into the Wisconsin river from their mouths upstream to the first highway bridge, except the Baraboo river which has the year round season for its entire length.

SECTION 4. NR 20.02 (3)(am) 26. is renumbered 27.

SECTION 5. NR 20.04(3)(am)26. is created to read:

NR 20.04(3)(am) 26. Yellow River including all sloughs, bayous and flowages from the highway 54 dam at Dexterville, Wood county, downstream to its confluence with the Castle Rock flowage in Juneau county.

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SECTION 6. NR 20.06(1)(b) (intro.) is amended to read:

NR 20.06(1)(b)(intro.) Trolling. It-shall-be-unlawful-for-any-person to-take,-capture-or-kill-fish-or-fish-for-fish-or-fish-of-any-variety-at-any time No person may fish in the inland waters of the state from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion; or by means of shutting or drawing of water for that purpose. Casting and immediate retrieval of a bait or lure while positioning a boat by means of an electric motor, where motors are permitted, shall-net-be-deemed is not trolling. The restrictions in this paragraph do not apply to the waters of Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas, Polk, Racine, Rusk, Taylor, Washburn and Waukesha counties, the Wisconsin river from county trunk A east of Tomahawk, Lincoln county, downstream, except Lake Mohawksin, the Chippewa river including sloughs, bayous and flowages up to the flowing portion of all tributary streams from the Holcombe flowage, Chippewa county, downstream, the Fox river from Buffalo lake downstream to the DePere dam and the following named lakes and rivers including their flowages and sloughs:

SECTION 7. NR 20.06(1)(b)42. and 64. are repealed.

SECTION 8. NR 20.09(2)(q) is amended to read:

NR 20.09(2)(g) A dip net not exceeding 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square may be used in all other waters except designated trout streams at any time of the year, sunrise to sunset, for the taking of rough fish with no bag or possession limit except-for-suckers-and-redherse-for-which-there-is-an aggregate daily-bag-limit-of-50.

SECTION 9. NR 21.12(5)(a) is amended to read:

NR 20.12(5)(a) Set or bank poles and setlines may not use stainless steel hooks or be equipped with any hook smaller than 3/4 inch gap except that on the Mississippi river stainless steel hooks may be used and there is no hook size restriction.

SECTION 10. NR 21.12(1)(a) is amended to read:

At one end of every licensed setline, there shall be placed and maintained a white flag, not less than 16 inches square, with the upper end of the shaft extending at least 2 feet above the water and numbered with figures at least 3 inches in height corresponding with the number of the license authorizing the use of such setline. It shall be lawful to use buoys in lieu of flags providing that same are numbered with figures at least 3 inches in height corresponding with the number of the license authorizing the use of such setlines.

Lines must shall be lifted and fish removed at least once each day following the day set unless a longer period is granted by the department or its agents.

Additional restriction are contained in s. NR 22.11.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on July 24, 1986.
