ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CREATING RULES

To create Chapter PI 20, relating to the disposition of funds.

Analysis Provided by the Department of Public Instruction

Sec. 20.907(5), Stats., provides that all monies coming into the possession of any officer or employe of a state agency by virtue of his or her office or employment shall be deposited with the state treasurer. However, the statute further provides that if any agency receives monies incident to an authorized activity which are not appropriated and not directed to be deposited with the state treasurer, the agency may adopt a rule which prescribes procedures in accordance with Chapter 34 Public Deposits for the disposition of monies received incident to an authorized activity.

Several department employes receive and dispose of funds in fulfilling their job duties. These duties include:

- 1) Consultant and advisory activities to statewide public school vocational youth organizations such as the Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA), Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA), Vocational Industrial Clubs of America (VICA), Future Farmers of America (FFA), Future Homemakers of America-Home Economics Related Occupations (FHA-HERO), and others. These activities are part of the department's responsibility for vocational education under the Carl Perkins Vocational Education Act.
- 2) Custodial duties at the two state residential schools (Wisconsin School for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired and Wisconsin School for the Visually Handicapped) for parents' deposits of cash for their children's needs, as well as receiving funds from individuals or organizations which are donated for the specific benefit of the students in residence, and funds such as for class or club projects.

The proposed rule states that the state superintendent and the school superintendents at the residential schools may receive and expend funds connected with these activities. Complete and accurate records must be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting, auditing, and internal control principles and practices.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Department of Public Instruction by

s. 20.907(5), Stats., and 227.11(2)(a), Stats., as affected by 1985 Wisconsin Act 182,

and interpreting ss. 20.907(5) and 20.255(1)(jr) and (L), Stats., the state superintendent

of public instruction hereby creates rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter PI 20 is created to read:

WISCONSIN SCHOOL FOR THE VISUALLY HANDICAPPED. (1) The superintendents of

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the Wisconsin school for the deaf and hearing impaired and the Wisconsin school for the 1 2 visually handicapped may receive and expend funds incident to the following activities: 3 (a) Funds received from parents for the use of students in residence; (b) Gifts from the public or from specific activities carried out by individuals or 5 organizations for the benefit of the students; or 6 Funds received from student organized social or business activities carried out with the approval of the school superintendent. 7 8 (2) A separate checking account or accounts for funds described in sub. (1) shall 9 be established by each residential school superintendent in a public depository as defined 10 under s. 34.01(5), Stats., with accrued interest added to the account. 11 PI 20.05 RECORDS. (1) Complete, accurate and auditable records of all accounts 12 established under ss. PI 20.03 and 20.04, shall be maintained by the department.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.22(2) (intro.), Stats., as affected by 1985 Wisconsin Act 182.
