ORDER
ADOPTING
RULE LIMITATIONS.

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation
General summary of Rule. This amendment of s. Trans $276.0 \overline{7(1)}$ adds seven sections of highway to the designated highway system, as provided by s. $348.07(4)$, Wis. stats. The permanent amendment provisions add three segments of highway to the four included in the emergency amendment now in effect.

Generally, no person may operate any single vehicle with an overall length in excess of 40 feet, or any combination of 2 vehicles with an overall length in excess of 60 feet, or a semitrailer longer than 48 feet, or an automobile haulaway longer than 66 feet plus allowed overhangs, on Wisconsin's highways without a permit. Certain exceptions are provided under $s$. 348.07(2), stats.

The effect of this amendment will be to extend the provisions of s. $348.07(2)(f)$ (fm), (gm) and (gr) and s. $348.08(\mathrm{l})(\mathrm{e})$, Stats. to seven additional segments of highway. four of these segments are now designated by an emergency rule, effective June 6, 1986. As a result of this amendment, there will be no overall length limitation for a tractor-semitrailer combination, a double bottom or an automobile haulaway on the affected highway segments. There will be no length limitation for a truck tractor or road tractor when operated in a tractor-semitrailer combination or as part of a double bottom or an automobile haulaway. Double bottoms will be allowed to operate on the affected highway segments, provided neither trailer unit is longer than 28 feet 6 inches. Semitrailers up to 53 feet long will also be allowed to be operated, provided the kingpin to rear axle distance does not exceed 41 feet. This distance is measured from the kingpin to the center of the rear axle, or, if the semitrailer has a tandem axle, to a point midway between the first and last axle of the tandem. Otherwise, semitrailers, including semitrailers which are part of an automobile haulaway, are limited to 48 feet in length.

These vehicles and combinations will also be allowed to operate on undesignated highways for a distance of 5 miles or less in order to obtain access to a designated highway or to reach fuel, food, maintenance, repair, rest, staging, terminal or vehicle assembly facilities or points of loading or unloading.

The highway segments added to the designated highway system by this amendment are:

1. U.S. Highway 10 from the Minnesota State Line at Prescott to U.S. Highway 63 west of Ellsworth;
2. State Trunk Highway 29 from U.S. Highway 10 in Prescott to State Trunk Highway 35 in River Falls;
3. State Trunk Highway 35 from U.S. Highway 10 in Ellsworth to State Trunk Highway 29 in River Falls;
4. State Trunk Highway 35 from River Falls to Interstate Highway 94 east of Hudson;
5. State Trunk Highway 64 from U.S. Highway 141 north of Pound to U.S. Highway 41 in Marinette;
6. State Trunk Highway 65 from State Trunk Highway 35 north of River Falls to Interstate Highway 94 south of Roberts; and
7. State Trunk Highway 71 from Norwalk to State Trunk Highway 131 south of Tomah.

The communities located along these highway segments include: Prescott, Trimbelle, Ellsworth, Beldenville, River Falls, Marinette, Norwalk and Wilton.

All of the above highway segments have been part of the designated highway system since June 6,1986 , by an emergency rule, except the following:

1. State Trunk Highway 29 from U.S. Highway 10 in Prescott to State Trunk Highway 35 in River Falls.
2. State Trunk Highway 35 to U.S. Highway 10 in Ellsworth to State Trunk Highway 29 in River Falls.
3. State Trunk Highway 65 from State Trunk Highway 35 north of River Falls to Interstate Highway 94 south of Roberts.

The other amendments to the description of highway segments in s. Trans 276.07 do not add to, or subtract from, the designated highway system. These changes are simply the result of changes to the highway numbers. All of State Trunk Highway 74 east of U.S. Highway 41 has been renumbered State Trunk Highway 100. This means that State Trunk Highway 100 is now a continuous designated highway segment between Interstate Highway 94 at Oak Creek and Interstate Highway 43 in Milwaukee. Renumbering also requires a different description of the western end of the designated portion of County Trunk Highway "PP" in Milwaukee County. All of State Trunk Highway 114 has been renumbered County Trunk Highway "PP" in Calumet County and the amendments reflect this renumbering.

Finally s. Trans 276.07 has been revised to divide the list of designated highways into several subsections. This is intended to facilitate any necessary future amendment of the section by allowing only the affected subsection to be printed in notices and orders instead of the entire designated highway system list.

Authority for Rule. Section 348.07(4), Stats., as amended by 1985 Wis Act 165 , provides that the secretary of the department of transportation shall designate, by administrative rule, highways to which s. 348.07(2)(f), (fm), (gm) and (gr) and s. 348.08(l)(e), Stats. shall apply.

Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis. The rule has no direct adverse effect on small businesses.

Fiscal Estimate. The Department estimates that there will be no direct fiscal impact of this amendment of $s$. Trans 276.07(1), Wis. Admin. Code.
